“What is Little Lake?”

Many times, I am asked by people I meet, “Where exactly is Little Lake?” and “Is there really a lake there?” After describing where we are located and most especially after describing the many accomplishments of our schools, I am then met with a sense of interest and more probing questions about our district and its success. In an effort to spread the news about Little Lake, I would like to share five reasons that attract parents, teachers, staff and students to our district.

Reason #1: Little Lake teachers are extraordinary. Not only are they highly qualified by state and national standards, they are caring, knowledgeable and effective in educating our students and in building their self-esteem as solid citizens and capable learners. A number of Little Lake teachers have been recognized by the county and the state as Teachers of the Year for their stellar performance in the classroom. Little Lake teachers truly exemplify our district beliefs: Students First! Results Matter! Whatever It Takes!

Reason #2: Little Lake schools are high achieving. All nine schools (seven elementary and two middle) have recently been named California Gold Ribbon Schools and California Title I Academic Achievement Award Schools. Both middle schools have also been recently recognized as a national redesignated “Schools to Watch.” Our schools have also earned one or more state and national distinctions such as the National Blue Ribbon Award, California Distinguished School, and California Business for Education Excellence Honor Roll School. Student proficiency rates continue to increase

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Schools to Watch District

In June of 2018 the National Forum to Accelerate Middle-Grades Reform recognized the Little Lake City School District as a Schools to Watch District. There are currently 17 recognized Schools to Watch Districts in the country. In June of 2019, the Little Lake City School District will again be recognized as a National Schools to Watch District. This distinction is awarded to our district as a result of both Lakeside and Lake Center being recognized as California Schools to Watch as well as National Schools to Watch.

Each year, the Schools to Watch program identifies middle schools that are academically excellent, developmentally responsive, socially equitable, and structured for success. The sites selected to be Schools to Watch meet the unique challenges

of their student populations and share a strong, ongoing record of student achievement. In the words of State Superintendent Tony Thurmond, "These middle schools make a great impact on students, and I want to thank the staff, administrators, teachers, and parents at these schools for ensuring all students get the education they need to realize their potential," Thurmond said. "These schools study and support students' needs, which helps close achievement gaps and creates a better future for these young students."

In 2015 Lakeside Middle School was first designated a California and a National School to Watch while the following year in 2016 Lake Center became a California and a National School to Watch. Following a rigorous application process, both schools hosted a team of middle school experts who observed in classrooms, reviewed documentation, and interviewed students, staff, parents and community leaders. The Schools to Watch Award was presented to the two school's representatives in Sacramento in February and again in Washington, D.C. in June.

In order to maintain the School to Watch title and distinction, designated schools must be re-evaluated every three years. The re-evaluation process again involves another rigorous application process, hosting a team of middle school experts to observe in classrooms, review documentation, and interview students, staff, parents and community leaders. In 2018 Lakeside was honored in Sacramento and Washington D.C. as a redesignated School to Watch and in 2019 Lake Center was honored in Sacramento and will be honored in Washington D.C as a redesignated School to Watch. With both middle schools being recognized as California and National Schools to Watch, the Little Lake City School District can proudly call itself a School to Watch District, an honor officially bestowed on us by the National Forum to Accelerate Middle-Grades Reform.

All of these distinctions are a direct result of the outstanding teamwork among our teachers, students, administrators and support staff. In addition, we could not be successful without the support of our Board of Education, our active and engaged parents, and the communities we serve. As California and the district move forward into an era of new and more rigorous standards, we as a district community are motivated and committed to ensuring success for every student.

Un Distrito de Escuelas para Observar

En Junio de 2018, el Foro Nacional para Acelerar la Reforma de los Grados Intermedios reconoció al Distrito Escolar Little Lake City como un Distrito de Escuelas para Observar (Schools to Watch). Actualmente existen 17 Distritos de Escuelas para Observar reconocidos en el país. En Junio de 2019, el Distrito Escolar Little Lake City será nuevamente reconocido como un Distrito de Escuelas Nacionales para Observar. Esta distinción se otorga a nuestro distrito como resultado de que tanto Lakeside como Lake Center son reconocidas como Escuelas para Observar de California, así como Escuelas para Observar Nacionales.

Cada año, el programa Escuelas para Observar identifica a las escuelas intermedias que son académicamente excelentes, receptivas al desarrollo, son socialmente equitativas y están estructuradas para el éxito. Los planteles escolares seleccionados como Escuelas para Observar cumplen con los retos específicos de sus poblaciones estudiantiles y comparten un registro sólido y continuo rendimiento académico de los alumnos. En palabras

del superintendente estatal Tony Thurmond, "Estas escuelas intermedias tienen un gran impacto en los estudiantes, y quiero agradecer al personal, administradores, maestros y padres de estas escuelas por garantizar que todos los alumnos reciban la educación que necesitan para desarrollar su potencial", Dijo Thurmond. "Estas escuelas analizan y apoyan las necesidades de los estudiantes, lo que ayuda a reducir las brechas de logros académicos y crea un mejor futuro para estos jóvenes estudiantes".

En el año 2015, la Escuela Intermedia Lakeside fue designada por primera vez como Escuela para Observar de California y a nivel Nacional, mientras que el año siguiente, en 2016, Lake Center también se convirtió en Escuela para Observar de California y Nacional. Luego de un riguroso proceso de aplicación, ambas escuelas recibieron a un equipo de expertos de escuelas intermedias que observaron en las aulas, revisaron la documentación y entrevistaron a estudiantes, personal, padres y líderes de la comunidad. El Premio Escuelas para Observar fue entregado a los representantes de las dos escuelas en Sacramento, en el mes de Febrero y nuevamente en Washington, D.C, en el mes de Junio.

A fin de mantener el título y la distinción de Escuela para Observar, las escuelas designadas deben ser reevaluadas cada tres años. El proceso de reevaluación nuevamente involucra otro riguroso proceso de aplicación, con un equipo de expertos de escuelas intermedias que observan en las aulas, revisan la documentación y entrevistan a estudiantes, personal, padres y líderes de la comunidad. En el año 2018, Lakeside fue galardonada en Sacramento y en Washington D.C como una Escuela para Observar rediseñada y en 2019, Lake Center fue honrada en Sacramento y será honrada en Washington D.C como una Escuela para Observar rediseñada. Con el reconocimiento de que ambas escuelas intermedias son Escuelas de California y Escuelas Nacionales para Observar, el Distrito Escolar de Little Lake City puede denominarse Distrito de Escuelas para Observar, un honor que nos otorga oficialmente el Foro Nacional para Acelerar la Reforma de los Grados Intermedios.

Todas estas distinciones son el resultado directo del excelente trabajo en equipo entre nuestros maestros, estudiantes, administradores y personal de apoyo. Además, no podríamos tener éxito sin el apoyo de nuestra Junta de Educación, nuestros activos y comprometidos padres, así como de las comunidades a las que servimos. A medida que California y el distrito avanzan hacia una era de estándares nuevos y más rigurosos, nosotros, como comunidad del distrito, estamos motivados y comprometidos a garantizar el éxito de cada estudiante.

It is with great pride that we announce that Lake Center Middle School has been re-designated as a Schools to Watch® recipient. Schools to Watch® is an initiative launched in 1999 to identify high-performing schools across the United States that meet the following criteria: they are academically excellent; they are developmentally responsive; and they are socially equitable, democratic, and fair. Schools seeking this level of academic excellence have a sense of purpose that drives every facet of practice and decision-making. Through established norms, structures, and organizational arrangements, students learn to understand important concepts, develop essential skills, and apply what they learn to real-world problems.

In order to assess eligibility, teachers complete a self-study and rating rubric. The results of the self-study are then used as a tool for continuous improvement in an effort to seek re-designation as a Schools to Watch® school. The last part of the re-designation process included a visit by a team of Schools to Watch® professionals, who spend a day visiting classrooms to validate our collective efforts. The day concluded with a forum in which a panel of administrators, Board members, and teachers answered questions and commented upon what we know best: educating the middle-school youths of our wonderful community!

Throughout the initial and re-designation processes, teachers and administrators put in countless hours to document all the wonderful things occurring on a constant basis at Lake Center. Leading the way are the teachers' abilities to meet student needs and connect interpersonally with them, followed by providing extracurricular activities to highlight their skills and knowledge. Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Night, the Science Club's butterfly garden, and the Geography Bee are just a few things that have allowed our students to shine their light and knowledge.

We will be celebrating our success with a team of teachers, administrators, and Board members in Washington D.C. this year. The staff at Lake Center looks forward in continuing to provide our students with academically excellent programs that model what it means to take center stage!

As we get closer to the end of the school year, it is with great pride that I highlight our efforts at Lakeside to provide a safe and welcoming environment for all students, especially in the area of bully prevention. According to the *Journal of Adolescence*, "social support can protect victims of bullying from adverse outcomes" (vol. 34, issue 3).

Our Leadership Class students provided active social support by preparing and facilitating three student assemblies that promoted empathy, respect and kindness. To send positive messages rather than the negative ones seen in much of our social media, the same group of student leaders organized a "compliment card table." Students wrote positive messages to other students, which were then delivered to those students the following day. This was such an engaging activity that it was brought back by popular demand. Members of Youth Alive!, our faith-based club, organized Share the Love Week soon after the assemblies. This group wrote thank-you notes to our classified and certificated staff, prepared Blessing Bags for homeless people, and hosted a pizza party and raffle for the first 50 students in the library! Parents also supported a positive environment by attending meetings in which they learned how to protect their children from bullying on social media.

Our staff continues to implement PRIDE, representing our values and expectations, to develop our students' ability to regulate their own behavior and to understand the importance of doing the right thing even when no one is looking. In addition, we have established counseling services within our school and our community for our students and their families who need the extra support.

It is our belief that our students and staff above all need to feel safe. Only then can we continue onward toward academic excellence. Go Mustangs!


- A talented support staff that literally keeps the district running and enables teachers to perform their jobs.
