On Monday April 19, 2021, the Newhall School District finally opened its doors for full time in-person instruction for the first time since March 13, 2020. Who would have ever imagined it would have taken 402 days for this to happen? The opportunity for students to get back with their peers is important. The interactions with other students and staff, the social emotional piece, has really weighed on everyone. Our teachers worked so hard to create engaging distance learning lessons for their students, but it just is not the same as being inside the walls of a school for most of our children. Walking into classrooms on that first full day back was a definite feel good moment. Kids having the opportunity to play at recess together for the first time all year was the highlight of the day as I spoke with students. Seeing students eating lunch at school with a close friend despite being six feet apart, felt like a major step in the right direction towards our normal routines. These last eight weeks of school are so critical for all of us to get back into a groove before we head off to summer. Having this opportunity to work out the kinks so we are ready to hit the ground running in the fall is a true blessing. We did it!

McGrath PTA Emergency Bin Donation

Parents and PTAs are vital partners for schools. This year, the pandemic truly gave the McGrath PTA time to reflect and consider preparations for the variety of natural disasters that can take place. Knowing that students activities did not require the same level of funding, the McGrath PTA chose to utilize this years funds to review the McGrath emergency bin and restock necessary supplies, thus guaranteeing that our children will be prepared and safe at school.

Preparation includes inventory and date checking, ensuring that the emergency bin is stocked with water, food and other supplies such as batteries, first-aid supplies and other materials necessary if an emergency occurred. Food, water, blankets and other basic needs were reviewed in case students were required to remain on campus for multiple days. The McGrath PTA donated \$7,000 for emergency bin supplies and the staff and students are so very grateful for their care.

Los padres y las PTAs son socios fundamentales para las escuelas. Este año, la pandemia realmente le dio tiempo a la PTA de McGrath para considerar los preparativos para la variedad de desastres naturales que pueden ocurrir. Sabiendo que las actividades de los estudiantes no requerían el mismo nivel de financiación, la PTA de McGrath decidió utilizar los fondos de este año para revisar el contenedor de emergencia de McGrath y proporcionar los suministros necesarios, garantizando que nuestros niños estén preparados y seguros en la escuela.

La preparación incluye verificación de inventario y fechas de vencimiento, asegurándose de que el contenedor de emergencia tenga agua, alimentos y otros suministros como baterías, suministros de primeros auxilios y otros materiales necesarios en caso de emergencia. Se revisaron los alimentos, el agua, las mantas y otras necesidades básicas en caso de que los estudiantes tuvieran que permanecer en la escuela durante varios días. El PTA de McGrath donó \$7,000 para suministros de emergencia y el personal y los estudiantes están muy agradecidos por su atención.

read. Good readers interact with text, gain knowledge, and perform well academically. This McGrath partnership with parents ensures that our students are successful.

McGrath also teams up with parents to create a culture of reading at home. Along with our parenting programs, we also host several special guest presentations that include free online resources for students and families. Ms. Purdy, the librarian at the Santa Clarita Public Library, has shared with our families all of the Newhall Library’s resources for

parents. This wealth of material includes free audio books and free online tutoring. The Newhall Library has also provided our students with break time videos addressing language, movement, self-care, STEM, and social emotional learning.

Recently, a special guest, Ms. Chelsea Gutowski, one of our very own NSD library media technicians, shared different tools and tips for parents. Ms. Gutowski is a graduate student who is studying library and information science at LSU. Ms. Gutowski shared with us that mindset is everything, and in order for students to develop a love for reading, they need three things. They need access to a large variety of high-interest books, the freedom to read what they like, and adult role models who also enjoy reading.

Reading at home should be about creativity, exploration, and discovery. Our goal is to make sure that all of our students are lifelong readers.

Supporting All Students

While we may not know in detail what our school year might look like in 2021–22, we do know that we will need to continue to support each student with what they individually need, both socially-emotionally and academically. Learning-loss mitigation will be addressed beginning with districtwide programs like summer LEAP to Learning for general-education students and our traditional ESY program for students in our SDC classrooms.

One of our Blue Ribbon Practices before COVID-19 at Pico Canyon centered on What I Need time or (WIN) blocks of intervention or enrichment for our students. At each grade level, a cycle of learning in ELA or math will be followed up next year with this WIN time, giving each student what they individually need academically.

Socially-emotionally, we will support our students with

our schoolwide Positive Interventions and Support (PBIS) efforts. We have a continuum of behavior supports designed for all students and implemented in all areas of the school. Our wonderful full-time school counselor will continue to provide information to our parents; she will deliver lessons to each classroom, and she will meet with students for social skills as well as individually identified needs. Student connectedness is very much supported through the efforts of our PTA. Student-centered events such as assemblies, dances, International Night, Variety Show, Reflections, movie nights and field trips help our students to develop Husky Pride.

At the school site, we will continue to monitor our students closely at Pico Canyon as they return for a new school year. We know that our students' academic successes are a result of schoolwide systems and shared leadership. All adults at Pico will continue to ensure that we create a student-centered community from the moment a child steps onto our campus as we move into the next phase of what the future holds for us all!

The ELAC meetings are essentially an arena where parents get to put forth their thoughts and concerns about their children's education at the site and district level. Our role is to support, inform, and empower our families to become active participants in their children's education.
