MUSD COVID-19 Dashboard

To ensure transparent and accurate information regarding COVID-19 cases within our district, we are providing a dashboard as of the start of the 2021-22 school year. A link to the dashboard is located on the district's COVID-19 webpage. All data in the dashboard indicate confirmed active cases among our students and staff. Dashboard data is updated within 24 hours of learning of any confirmed active cases, and is not updated on weekends or other non-school days. Cases are removed from the dashboard once the student or staff member is cleared to return to school or work.

ParentSquare is an important tool for our parents and families to stay connected with news and information that is happening in our schools and around the district. We have added a ParentSquare section to our district and school websites for parents who would like to learn more about Parent Square and how to sign up. On August 12, 2021, the installation of Clifton's college and career lab was completed. In partnership with Paxton-Patterson Laboratories and Monrovia Unified School District Educational Services, Clifton has expanded opportunities for students to gain exposure to 16 different STEM related fields of study. Some examples include structural engineering, pneumatics, digital manufacturing, sports medicine, and digital audio production. Each unit of study takes two weeks to complete and students have the choice of what units they would like to learn more about. The laboratory provides college and/or career pathways to the high school level where students can continue their education and achieve industry certifications or further their education as they move into college.

Best Friends


Title: *Narwhal's Otter Friend*

Title: *The City of Ember*


Author: Jeanne DuPrau


