## Growth of Brea Brings Expansion Need of BOUSD Campuses

In anticipation of six housing developments constructed over the next 10 years in the City of Brea, the Brea Olinda Unified School District is in the process of doing an analysis of its facilities. It is estimated that the new housing communities will bring in approximately 680 students. Combine that with the fact BOUSD was just one of two Orange County school districts that

had an increased growth rate prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, there is an imminent need for expanding our campuses to accommodate the projected enrollment.

Looking ahead, and with continued collaboration with the City of Brea, we are investigating ways to build out our schools to fit the needs of the forecasted student population. At the June 14, 2021, and October 14, 2021, Board of Education Study Sessions, recommendations of potential solutions were presented to the Board Trustees to obtain their recommendations. One immediate way we are accommodating the situation is with the addition of three portables at Laurel Elementary Magnet School and one at Falcon Academy of Science & Technology for the 2022-23 school year. We are also addressing other ways to assist with our anticipated need for classroom capacity expansion.

It is definitely exciting times in Brea, but with the growth lies obstacles we need to overcome. We want the community to know that BOUSD will be ready when our new families arrive in this wonderful city!

### The Math Girl


Title: *The Miscalculations of Lightning Girl*


