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

Bud Carson Middle School is proud to launch a new school program inspired by the Kindness Club. BCMS Kindbassadors meet monthly with me to plan schoolwide programs and

kind! The KINDbassador program serves as a great leadership opportunity, supports student involvement, and facilitates positive peer interactions.

Students were asked to apply and share about qualities, skills and experiences that would support their selection as a grade-level representative. We had more than 60 students apply for the 18 KINDbassaador positions—that’s six for each grade level.

College Application Season begins at HMSA!

HMSA has officially begun its college admission season for our Class of 2022. All seniors will be applying to at least one California State University, whose application window opened on October 1, 2021 and ends on November 30, 2021. The HMSA counseling department has been visiting classrooms to help students through the application

process. On November 1, 2021, seniors will begin their University of California and private college applications. Students and their families will also participate in

workshops about how to complete the FAFSA. Based on student exit surveys and college acceptance letter verification, 99% of the Class of 2021 planned on continuing their education the Fall after graduation, 69% planned on attending a 4 year university and 30% planned on attending a community college. According to the most recent California Department of Education’s College Going Report, HMSA’s College Going Rate for the Class of 2018 was 89.2%, while LA County’s rate was 61.9%, and the Class of 2017 was 92.2%, while LA County’s rate was 64.8% (<https://dq.cde.ca.gov/dataquest/>). The data continues to show that HMSA is preparing its students for college success.


Olweus Anti-Bullying Kick-Off

Eucalyptus kicked off our anti-bullying program this year on Friday, October 29th with HERO Day (Helping Everyone Respect Others) by dressing like superheroes to, “Have the power to say NO to bullying.” The district has implemented the Olweus Anti-Bullying Program to teach our students, staff, and parents about bullying and how to put a stop to it.

The definition of bullying, according to our program, is “when someone repeatedly and on purpose says or does mean or hurtful things to another person who has a hard time defending himself or herself.” Faculty members, including teachers, custodians, our security officer, counselor, psychologist, and dean, were all trained to teach our staff and students how to respond to bullying.

One key element of our Olweus anti-bullying program is the weekly class meetings held by all grade levels. These meetings help to reduce existing bullying problems, prevent the development of bullying problems, and achieve better peer relations among our students here at school.

We recently mounted the anti-bullying rules on a mural along with a dedication to “Officer Chris” Mclellan, our former security officer whose passion was to protect our students and staff.

One Big Puzzle


Title: *Holes*



Title: *Breakaway*



Hideout at the Museum


Title: *The Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler*

Forced to Grow Up


Kryisia by Krystyna

The Tomb of a Dead Emperor

The Tyrant's Tomb is the fourth book in Rick Riordan's series, *Trials of Apollo*. Apollo (aka Lester Papadopoulos) was banished from Mount Olympus (home of the Greek Gods) by the



almighty Zeus. During his exile, he experienced many adventures and losses. Meg, his 12 year-old gifted assistant, travels with him to a Roman demi-god camp, where they are greeted by lots of old war friends. Apollo has a vision and tells the camp to prepare for a gruesome war caused by two evil Roman emperors, both with whom Apollo had treacherously fought recently. He then needs to go on a dangerous journey investigating a Roman ghost tomb for crucial information. The vivid details of the battle preparation and fighting scenes are riveting. 

Yoona is a 4th grader. She likes to read books and create stories. She also enjoys playing soccer.



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
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
