School District successfully welcomed our students back for increased on-campus instruction and our classrooms were once again filled with happy and healthy children eager to learn. We also welcomed additional students to our newest school, Brea Online Academy, for those that want to continue their studies in the comfort of their home. With the 2020-21 school year coming

to a close in a few weeks, we now shift our focus to the future. Governor Newsom recently stated that "schools and institutions of higher education should conduct full-time, in-person instruction, in compliance with Cal/ OHSA emergency temporary standards and public health guidelines," it's a signal to us that for the fall we will be open for business. Our plan is to return full-time, five days a week, which includes the restoration of academic programs and enrichment activities such as arts, athletics and clubs.

The Online Academy (elementary) and Independent Study (secondary) will remain as options for the 2021-22 school year for families that have made different choices than in-person instruction. Our Online Academy will continue to provide 100% online learning led by highlytrained teachers that are well versed in online teaching and technology. Independent Study for the junior high and high school students allows for a more flexible schedule that includes regularly scheduled academic courses, with some online, and teacher check-ins. Tutoring services will also be available.

To make sure all our students are prepared for the 2021 fall semester, we are excited to announce a robust summer program to assist with any student that may need an academic boost. We are offering both an elementary and secondary program that covers core content areas. The district has also put in place the Extended School Year (ESY) for students with exceptional needs and who have services required by IEP.

While the district moves forward with the implementation of the Summer Boost program and the educational plan for the 2021-22 school year, we will continue to adhere to the safety guidelines set forth by the state in order to #FinishStrong!

On Monday, April 19th, the Laurel Elementary Magnet School of Innovation and Career Exploration welcomed back its students to campus on a five-day/full-day model. With only seven weeks of school left in the 2020-2021 school year, the entire staff approached this day with the same enthusiasm and energy of a first day of school in August.

Previously, in both the distance-learning and hybrid-learning models, a full reopening required planning and hard work from the entire school staff. Classified and certificated staff members collaborated to develop new protocols for the integration of staggered lunches, support for additional students at arrival and dismissal, mainstreaming schedules for students in the special education program, new instructional aide schedules, and other details related to student safety, support, and instruction.

David is in third grade and he loves to read and play piano. He likes math and outdoor activities such as rock climbing, tennis, and basketball.


