Staying the Course

As we have begun the transition into the second half of our school year, the district is continuing to navigate the challenges of the pandemic, while also moving ahead with very exciting and consequential work. In response to the unprecedented challenges of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, the District has stepped up and increased testing capacity at school sites as well as providing at home test kits for scholars and staff. This was done to ensure that we could maintain safe and healthy spaces across all school operations. Additionally, we have prioritized enhanced PPE for scholars and staff while on our campuses. We believe that our proactive approach to mitigating the impacts of the pandemic has enabled us to keep our schools open and thriving.

Additionally, lots of work is underway related to the Measure S Bond program. The Measure S Bond was approved by the community in November of 2020 and will provide \$79 million dollars over the next several years to increase, enhance, and modernize District facilities to ensure that our community and scholars have access to wonderful opportunities and programs across our schools. In the month of February, the District will be officially breaking ground on a new state of the gymnasium at Duarte High School. This is one example of the wonderful opportunities that are happening across the district as a result of the Measure S bond program.

The District has also made significant progress on critical issues that will move the district and community forward. During the December school board meeting, the board voted unanimously to consolidate and close Andres Duarte Arts Academy at the end of the 2021-2022 school year. This critical decision is in an effort to right size the District and respond to the ongoing challenges of declining enrollment. We are committed to creating conditions that will lead to a smooth and successful transition for everyone involved; and while we move forward with this process, our scholars, families, and staff will be actively supported the whole way through.

Mantener el camino

A medida que comenzamos la transición a la segunda mitad de nuestro año escolar, el distrito continúa navegando los desafíos de la pandemia, mientras avanza con un trabajo muy emocionante y consecuente. En respuesta a los desafíos sin precedentes de la variante Omicron de COVID-19, el Distrito ha intensificado y aumentado la capacidad de prueba en las escuelas, además de proporcionar pruebas para el hogar para los estudiantes y el personal. Esto se hizo para garantizar que pudiéramos mantener espacios seguros y saludables en todas las operaciones escolares. Además, hemos priorizado el PPE mejorado para los estudiantes y el personal mientras se encuentran en nuestras escuelas. Creemos que nuestro enfoque proactivo para mitigar los impactos de la pandemia nos ha permitido mantener nuestras escuelas abiertas y prósperas.

Además, se está realizando mucho trabajo relacionado con el programa de Bonos de la Medida S. El Bono de la Medida S fue aprobado por la comunidad en noviembre de 2020 y proporcionará \$79 millones de dólares durante los próximos años para aumentar, mejorar y modernizar las instalaciones del Distrito para garantizar que nuestra comunidad y los estudiantes tengan acceso a maravillosas oportunidades y programas en todas nuestras escuelas. En el mes de febrero, el Distrito iniciará oficialmente la construcción de un nuevo gimnasio en la preparatoria Duarte. Este es un ejemplo de las maravillosas oportunidades que están ocurriendo en todo el distrito como resultado del programa de bonos de la Medida S.

El Distrito también ha logrado un progreso significativo en temas críticos que harán avanzar al distrito y a la comunidad. Durante la junta de la mesa directiva de diciembre, la mesa votó por unanimidad para consolidar y cerrar la academia de artes Andrés Duarte al final del año escolar 2021-2022. Esta decisión crítica es un esfuerzo por dimensionar correctamente el Distrito y responder a los desafíos continuos de la disminución de la inscripción. Estamos comprometidos a crear condiciones que conduzcan a una transición exitosa y sin problemas para todos los involucrados; y mientras avanzamos con este proceso, nuestros estudiantes, familias y personal recibirán un apoyo activo durante todo el proceso.

Furthermore, the rich learning environment supports the child's ability to understand the musical elements of rhythm, melody, form, volume/softness, pitch, tempo, timbre, articulation, pattern, and style which in turn, fosters their natural interest in producing sounds as they play instruments. The connection between home and the activities that take place in our preschool program is the bridge to a successful experience in early childhood education.
