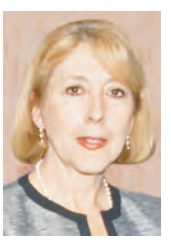

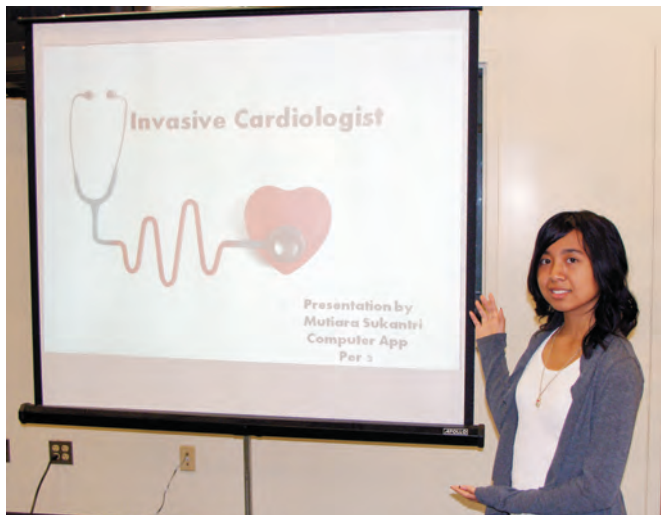

## Our College Culture

HMSA has a rich college culture. At each grade level, college is not only discussed by each teacher but is also addressed through the school's College Prep (CP) program. During sophomore year, the CP emphasis is on proficiency on the California High School Exit Exam. During junior year, the emphasis is on college assessment tests—the ACT and SAT. During senior year, the emphasis is on college applications and financial aid paperwork.

In October, seniors begin applying to colleges. The California State University and University of California application window opens on Oct. 1 of each year. This year, as in previous years, each senior applies to two universities of his or her choice. For two to four weeks, Mrs. Ramos helps each individual student as he or she completes post-graduate applications.

In addition to the CP program, HMSA's college culture is enhanced by college visitations. These visits are informational meetings held by admissions counselors from various colleges. Local colleges such as UC Los Angeles, CSU Dominguez Hills and Loyola Marymount University regularly visit the Aviator campus. More distant schools such as UC Merced, University of San Francisco and Cal Lutheran University also visit annually. HMSA has also had the pleasure of hosting informational meetings for out-of-state schools such as Amherst College and Cornell University.

According to Mr. Berumen, "our CP program, along with HMSA's dedicated faculty and focus on state standards, national testing, parent involvement, and graduation, all lend to HMSA's continuing college culture."

## A New Approach to Childhood Learning

A “preschool without walls” is similar to a regular preschool setting where children from one to five years of age, or infants, can come together in groups to learn through activities presented by an educator.

But a preschool without walls is also different in a major way. It invites both the children and their parents to participate in learning activities together. And not only are the children safely engaged and competently taught, the parents are also encouraged to learn a variety of new methods to interact with the youngsters at home so that they can continue the learning process for years to come.

Our free Preschool Without Walls program brings the classroom to the families and caregivers. Each of the subgroups at Washington showed similar growth: Hispanic, African-American, English learners and socioeconomically disadvantaged. The students at Washington are closing the achievement gap, thanks to the grade levels planning as a team each month and using results from data to determine intervention. The unit planning and data analysis processes at Washington are the key components here. The support staff works with the teachers to refine this practice, enabling the students to show continued academic growth.

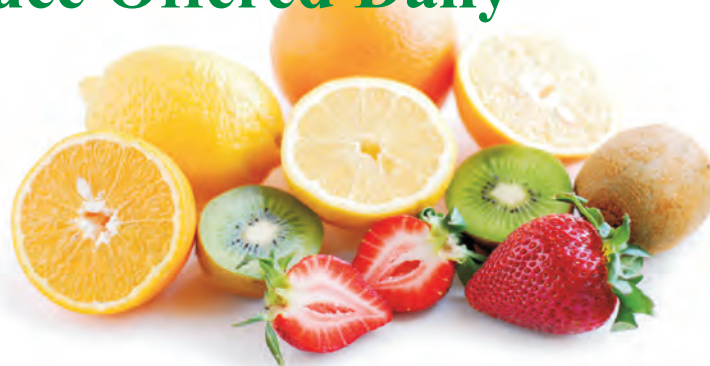
