Looking Forward to Another Amazing Year

Welcome back to the 2012-2013 school year! I anticipate that this year will be filled with great accomplishments and meaningful experiences and learning for our students. As we begin the year we have to address the fact that we continue to face unprecedented fiscal issues. The state continues to cut spending on education and to hold back funds due to districts. These challenges have been a reality for the last five years. In spite of operating under these difficult circumstances the staff of the Hawthorne School District has met these challenges. Our schools remain clean and safe, our classrooms continue to provide students with a quality education, we have expanded opportunities to our students with AVID and academies at our middle schools, and we continue to be recognized for outstanding achievement! Working together we continue our successes and keep our students in the forefront of all we do.

A few years ago the citizens of Hawthorne passed a bond to add to our high school buildings and to construct two new gymnasiums. The high school construction was completed and houses students in a new building. I am happy to report that the construction of our gymnasiums will begin in the late fall of 2012. They will be constructed at Prairie Vista Middle School and Bud Carson Middle School. I would like to clarify that while we face financial challenges, the funds for these projects are exclusively designated for these construction projects and cannot be spent on any other program or materials.

Also ahead in 2012 is the addition of transitional kindergarten in the Hawthorne School District. The state has passed legislation to move the admittance date back for incoming kindergarten students. In order to continue to serve those students who would have been admitted to kindergarten prior to the legislation a new program called transitional kindergarten (TK) was created. This program allows students whose date of birth is between November 1 and December 2 to be admitted into the TK class. This class is a two year kindergarten program. Research shows that the youngest kindergarten students are often those most at risk of experiencing failure in school. This new program is designed to provide younger students the gift of time for greater success. The students will be taught the core kindergarten program designed in a way to allow for additional time to be spent on enrichment and remediation when necessary.

I look forward to sharing more of our successes and projects throughout the next several issues of *School News* and look forward to another wonderful year!

Esperando Otro Año Impresionante

¡Bienvenidos al año escolar 2012-2013! Anticipo que este año estará lleno de logros y experiencias de aprendizaje significativas para nuestros estudiantes. Al comenzar el año tenemos que afrontar el hecho que seguimos enfrentándonos a problemas fiscales sin precedentes. El Estado sigue recortando gastos en la educación y posponiendo la entrega de fondos adeudados a los distritos. Estas dificultades han sido una realidad en los últimos cinco años. A pesar de operar en estas circunstancias difíciles el personal del Distrito Escolar de Hawthorne ha hecho frente a estos desafíos. Nuestras escuelas siguen limpias y seguras, nuestros salones continúan proporcionando calidad educativa a estudiantes, hemos aumentado oportunidades para nuestros estudiantes incorporando el programa AVID y academias en las escuelas intermedias, y seguimos teniendo reconocimiento por meritos sobresalientes. Trabajando juntos continuaremos teniendo éxitos y nuestros estudiantes seguirán siendo prioridad en todo lo que hacemos.

Hace algunos años los ciudadanos de Hawthorne aprobaron un bono para agregar edificios en nuestra preparatoria y para construir dos gimnasios nuevos. Terminamos la construcción en la preparatoria y alberga estudiantes en un edificio nuevo. Tengo el placer de informarles que la construcción de nuestros dos gimnasios comenzará a finales del otoño del 2012. Se construirán en las escuelas intermedias Prairie Vista y Bud Carson. Me gustaría aclarar que aunque estamos enfrentando dificultades financieras, estos fondos están diseñados exclusivamente en el uso de la construcción de estos proyectos y no pueden usarse en ningún otro gasto, programa o materiales.

También para el 2012 tenemos la adición del programa de transición del Jardín de Infantes en el Distrito Escolar de Hawthorne. El Estado aprobó una legislación para cambiar la fecha de admisión escolar para el Jardín de Infantes. Para poder continuar sirviendo a esos estudiantes que hubieran podido entrar al Jardín de Infantes antes que la legislatura cambiara, se creó un programa nuevo llamado Transición de Jardín de Infantes (TK siglas en Ingles). Este programa permite la admisión a clases de TK para los estudiantes que nacieron entre el 1 de noviembre y el 2 de diciembre. Esta clase consiste de dos años de Jardín de Infantes. Estudios muestran que estudiantes del Jardín de Infantes más pequeños corren un alto riesgo de fracasar en la escuela. Este programa está diseñado para darles el regalo del tiempo para que tengan un éxito mayor. Los estudiantes serán instruidos usando el currículo del Jardín de Infantes diseñado de forma que permitirá tener tiempo adicional para enriquecer y remediar a medida que sea necesaria.

Espero poder compartir más de nuestros éxitos y proyectos a través de las próximas ediciones de este periódico *School News* y que tengamos otro año extraordinario.
