Measure LL

I hope you and your family are enjoying the Spring! I wish to update you on an upcoming issue affecting our continued vision for safe, healthy, and award-winning schools.

While we all take pride in the fact that our District is one of the top performing in our area, as you well know, many of our schools were built 70 years ago. Like old homes, school sites need continued health and safety repairs including testing for asbestos and lead.

That is why our Board of Education recently decided to place Measure LL on the June 7th Ballot.

If passed by voters, Measure LL funding will help our District repair deteriorating bathrooms, leaky roofs, cracked asphalt and aging playgrounds; upgrade air filtration and purification and security systems; improve plumbing and electrical wiring, and make upgrades to meet current earthquake safety standards and fulfill accessibility requirements for disabled students.

The proposed Measure LL plan also includes funding to upgrade outdated electrical wiring, improve science, engineering, and computer instruction, and enhance Internet access, which will help ensure all students continue to have access to computers and instructional technology.

Measure LL is an \$36,000,000 school bond measure. If passed, it will cost homeowners 3 cents per \$100 of assessed value for a maximum financing term of up to thirty-two years.

Espero que usted y su familia estén disfrutando de esta primavera! Les escribo para darle una actualización sobre un tema próximo respecto a nuestra continua visión de tener escuelas seguras, saludables y reconocidas.

Si bien todos nos sentimos orgullosos de que nuestro Distrito es uno de los de mejor desempeño en nuestra área, como bien saben, muchas de nuestras escuelas se construyeron hace 70 años. Al igual que las casas antiguas, los planteles escolares necesitan reparaciones continuas relacionadas con la salud y seguridad, incluyendo pruebas de asbesto y plomo.

Es por esta razón que nuestra Junta de Educación recientemente tomó la decisión de colocar la Medida LL en la Boleta Electoral del próximo 7 de Junio.

Si los votantes la aprueban, los fondos de la Medida LL ayudarán a nuestro Distrito a reparar baños deteriorados, techos con goteras, asfalto agrietado y patios de recreo obsoletos; así como a actualizar los sistemas de filtración y purificación de aire y los sistemas de seguridad; mejorar la plomería y el cableado eléctrico y realizar actualizaciones para cumplir con los estándares actuales de seguridad contra sismos y cumplir con los requisitos de accesibilidad para estudiantes con discapacidades.

El plan propuesto de la Medida LL también incluye fondos para actualizar el antiguo cableado eléctrico, mejorar la instrucción en ciencias, ingeniería e informática y mejorar el acceso a Internet, lo que ayudará a garantizar que todos los estudiantes continúen teniendo acceso a computadoras y tecnología educativa.

La Medida LL es una medida de bonos escolares de \$36,000,000. Si se aprueba, le costará a los propietarios 3 centavos por cada \$100 del valor catastral por un plazo máximo de financiamiento de hasta treinta y dos años. Para obtener más información sobre la Medida LL, visite https://www.llcsd.net

Little Lake Middle Schools Again Named National Schools to Watch

Little Lake City School District is excited to announce that Lake Center Middle School and Lakeside Middle School have been redesignated as National Schools to Watch by the National Forum to Accelerate Middle-Grades Reform.

"The initial and redesignation process consists of a lengthy application process, an analysis of school practices, and a site validation visit. Little Lake City School District is honored to have completed the processes and have both middle schools going on a combined seven years as National Schools to Watch campuses," expresses Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Bill Crean.

On October 28, 2021, the National Forum conducted a Schools to Watch redesignation visit at Lake Center Middle School. The National Forum then recommended Lake Center Middle School for a Schools to Watch redesignation. Lake Center Middle School has been designated as a National School to Watch in 2016, 2019, and just recently, 2021.

Jack Sokoloff, the Lake Center Middle School Principal, shares, "This is the second time Lake Center has been redesignated as a National School to Watch, which is a true testament to our faculty and staff's hard work and dedication to our student's education."

Last school year, a Schools to Watch redesignation visit was also conducted by the National Forum at Lakeside Middle School, where they made the same recommendation. Lakeside Middle School has been designated as a National School to Watch in 2015, 2018, and 2021.

"We look forward to celebrating the redesignation of Lakeside at both the state and national conferences to honor the efforts our faculty and staff take to enhance student learning opportunities that prepare them for success in high school and beyond," states Lakeside Middle School Principal Ana Gutierrez.

Lake Center Middle School and Lakeside Middle School were honored in March at the California Schools to Watch Conference in Monterey, CA. On a national level, both middle schools will also be recognized at the upcoming Schools to Watch National Conference in Washington D.C in June.




This year is quickly coming to a close and it has certainly been a challenging year; however, as you read the articles in this issue you understand the students were focused on academics.

Does Your Child have Allergies... Or is it a Cold? Here's How to Find Out.

May is National Asthma and Allergy Awareness Month and it's around the time you start seeing running noses and itchy eyes. But is it a cold or allergies? Here are some tips to figure it out:

- Check the mucus, allergies tend to be thin and clear. Colds tend to be yellow or green and thick.
- Allergies tend to come on suddenly when your child is exposed to a trigger and lasts a while. Cold symptoms often start gradually and are done within two weeks.
- Typically, a fever won't be present in allergies, but colds come with a lowgrade fever.
- If your child has watery or itchy eyes, it might be an allergic reaction. Watery and itchy eyes aren't usually a cold symptom.

severity of allergies varies in children. Ranging from minor irritation to anaphylaxis, a potentially life-threatening allergic reaction.
