Appreciation

In November 2012, the voters of the Little Lake City School District approved two ballot measures that provide increased financial support for our schools. Measure EE, a general obligation bond, yielded funds to improve our facilities, most of which were built in the 1950s. Measure TT, a parcel tax in effect through 2018, was approved to increase student and teacher use of classroom technology, among other instructional needs. The funds from both of these measures have made a significant and positive difference for the students of Little Lake.

Funds from Measure TT, the parcel tax measure, have enabled the district to increase access and to enhance the effective use of instructional technology by students and teachers. Since the measure was passed, the district has been able to: provide up to date laptops for use by all district teachers; improve the ratio of computers to students through

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












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Board of Education – Consejo Educativo

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

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
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
