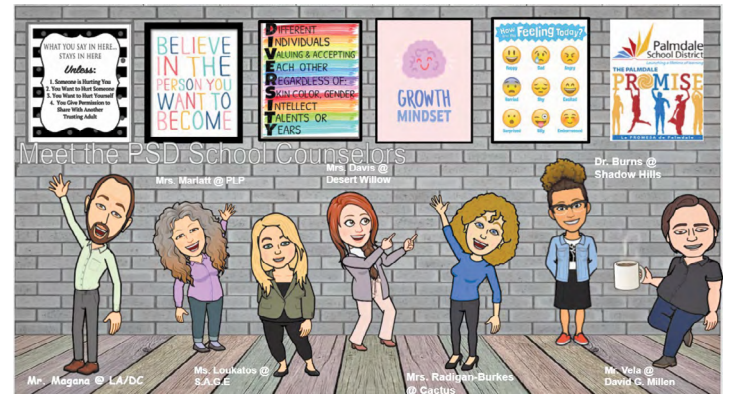
Settling-In for Learning

The PSD counselors are excited to be back at school and spending time interacting with students, staff members, and parents. Most are expressing how wonderful it is to be back in person!

The district's counselors are continuously offering support to all stakeholders. This includes coping skills and stress-reduction lessons. Student groups are also being held relating to grief and anger issues. Individual meetings are also being offered to deal with friendship problems, conflict resolution, and academic support.

The last several months have been stressful for everyone. The counseling staff has helped students (and staff members) become emotionally ready for learning and the new challenges ahead. Class visits have also commenced at selected sites to offer various mindfulness activities. These mindfulness and breathing exercises teach students how to refocus. They are a great tool to learn how to stay calm during stressful situations.

Many of our students have been anxious of the unknown but have since settled in. Counselors continue to remind our students, staff, and parents that we are available to help support them wherever they are.



In July, the W.E.B. adviser and a counselor trained student leaders on how to create a sense of belonging among our incoming sixth-graders, and helped lead the orientation. A large group of sixth-graders attended this orientation event, which included an assembly, small-group activities, and guided tours led by the W.E.B. leaders.

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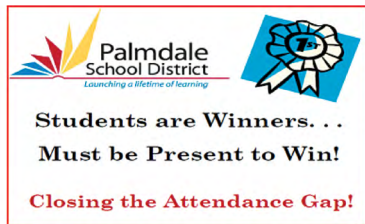

Maintaining a Balance

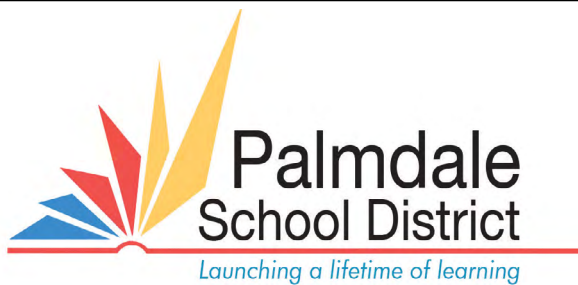

From the start of the school year, a close eye has been kept on students who need additional support services and resources. Groups have commenced at selected sites to address behavioral and social issues linked to anxiety, depression and post-traumatic stress disorder. One-to-one conferences continue to take place, and restorative practices allow for students to keep a balance. Several sites are using incentive activities during lunch to provide the much-needed mindfulness practices.

Social/emotional learning specialists (SELS) will soon provide support to the elementary school sites in order to provide early intervention to all Palmdale School District students. This approach will help reduce absenteeism, decrease incidences of behavior, and provide families greater support during the students' younger years.

Elementary site SELS will continue to provide instruction, case management, therapy and educationally required counseling services to students to promote mental health, positive social skills and personal growth. SELs will continue to highlight the importance of mental health and emotional well-being by working collaboratively with students, staff, parents and community members. The goal is to help students develop healthy coping skills by addressing their social and emotional needs and difficulties early on. Providing these services at an earlier time can help students build a strong foundation and grow into well-rounded students.

Palmdale School District sites has a local mental-health agency located at every site in an effort to eliminate all barriers and help students access mental-health services. The approach will be to promote a culture that connects and safeguards all students. SELs look forward to providing the services, practices and approaches that are designed for children and youth to implement the Palmdale Promise.

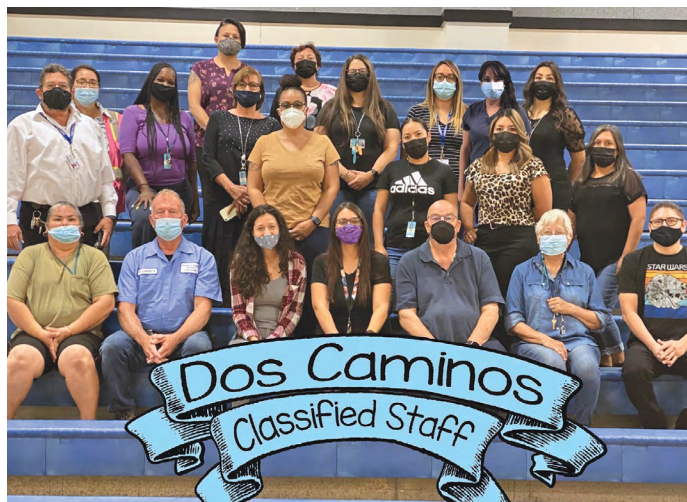

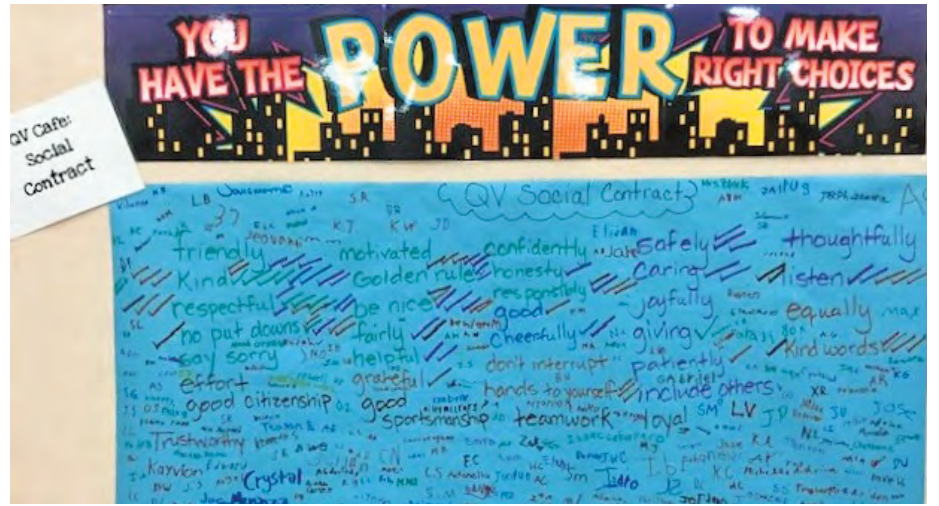

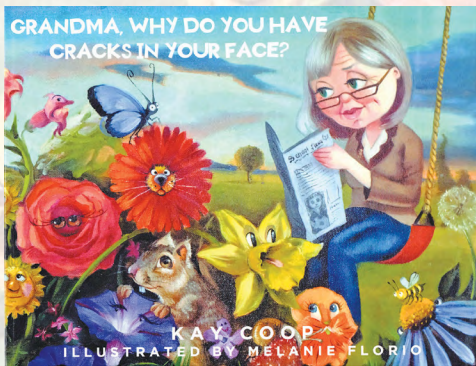
Renovations Aboard!
