School Lunch—Always Served!

The extension of the Emergency Meals Program through summer resulted in a record number of families served. Those who participated in our free-meal program when schools closed in March remained loyal customers throughout the summer. By the end of July, we served over 1.1 million free meals to our community. In addition to nine daily meal-distribution locations, we continued to deliver meals to our most needy families.

With the continuation of distance learning, Child Nutrition is still serving our PSD families with meal distribution three times per week during the day and two times per week in the evening to accommodate families who are at work during our typical mealtimes. We still deliver to families unable to reach our meal locations through a partnership with the Transportation Department and Storer. Additionally, we have occasional Food Truck Pop-Up Sweet Treat events at various schools. Our food truck, The Lunch Box, makes a surprise appearance during service time and hands out delicious fruity treats to our students.

Rain or shine, the Child Nutrition staff serves our families without exception. The pandemic has brought forth a unique opportunity to interact with parents that would not be possible under normal operating circumstances. It has been wonderful to see our community come together, and we are so grateful to the lunch guys and gals for their selflessness and dedication.


Weaving into Technology



What Fuels Team Success


Our third-grade team brings their talents, gifts and expertise to engage students in distance learning.
