#### **Measure C Improvements**

Measure C, the \$145-million school bond passed in 2008, will be completed by March 2013. The construction process

Dr. Steven Keller has been a fast-paced,

productive process with only a few sequential projects left for completion. Construction will begin at South Bay Adult School (SBAS), ideally, in the summer. The main gym at Redondo Union High School (RUHS) will be finished in March 2012, and we will begin work on the RUHS Student Union/Cafeteria this January, as well as the RUHS library. The industrial arts and science buildings at the high school will also be transformed starting in the spring.

On a separate note, since our facilities district-wide are truly outstanding and virtually unmatched, we will update the façade of the two-story 800 building (built in 2000) at RUHS to blend better with the new construction and modernization occurring on that site. This building, which closely resembles structures on our nemesis neighbor's campus to the north, will no longer share that identity. Even my wife who worked at Mira Costa would be jealous!

We truly believe that the makeover has transformed this community. We would like to sincerely thank the Board and the community for their support, enjoyment, and pride in the Measure C campaign and creation. The learning environment is extraordinarily ripe for success.

#### On Time and On Dime

After nearly four years, modernization and construction from the \$145-million Measure C Bond is approaching the finish line in the Redondo Beach Unified School District (RBUSD). Let's take a quick step back and think about all that's been accomplished and what remains to be completed.

Modernization at the elementary and middle schools was completed at the beginning of the school year. (Modernization of all classrooms was completed several years ago through Measure E.) Highlights include roofing, windows replacement, multipurpose Presiding Officer room refurbishment, and fencing at the elementary schools, a new,

modern Child Development Center at Lincoln Elementary School, and a new field turf soccer field at Washington Elementary School.

At the middle schools, two new, state-of-the-art gyms were constructed, as well as a field turf soccer field at Parras Middle School. In addition, the library at Parras was modernized this past summer, and natural solar lighting tubes were placed in both middle school libraries.

At our high school, Redondo Union High School (RUHS), which has seen the lion's share of modernization efforts for Measure C, our students and faculty can now enjoy a modernized performing arts auditorium, a new student services

Redondo Union High School Way back when, in August of 1905, Redondo's first bond was passed for a whopping \$25,000. It was spent on constructing a building for what was then Redondo Union's student body of 23—but soon to be 35!—students.

Flash-forward to 1947, when property taxes were increased \$1 for every \$100 of assessed valuation in order to build 24 new classrooms and a library and make various improvements to the athletic fields. Time-travel even further to 2000, when Measure E was passed by Redondo Beach voters. Measure E provided necessary infrastructure that enhanced the






The plans include new windows for the front office, wrought iron fences along the front of the school, painting, roofing, plumbing, electrical repairs, foliage, plants and many other small improvements.

In fall 2010, the doors opened to the well-designed Adams Middle School Gymnasium. This beautiful facility is used daily for physical education classes, intramural athletics, all school assemblies and pep rallies, registration, Back to School Night and

community events. Additionally, with the aid of solar tubes, fresh, natural light reduces the need for the use of electrical lighting.

In the summer of 2011, solar tubes were installed in the school cafeteria and music room. Wrought-iron fences replaced the chain-link fences around the front perimeter of the school campus. This distinctive look blends into the natural background while increasing campus safety for all. 

#### Come "C" What is New

Over the course of the last year, Measure C funding has brought a number of improvements to Lincoln Elementary School. There have been a wide variety of projects completed across campus, ranging from new wrought iron fencing to our most significant improvement, the new Childhood Development Center (CDC) complex.

The CDC project began with the complete demolition of our previous building and ended with the opening of a completely new CDC facility last spring. The CDC building has been certified by Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design (LEED), an internationally recog-

nized green building certification system. We are very proud of the new CDC, as it provides very high-quality learning environment for our youngest students.

While not as apparent as the CDC building, a number of additional Measure C improvements have helped beautify and improve the look of our campus. These include: newly coated blacktops on all playgrounds; new ball walls on both the lower and upper playgrounds; new wrought iron fencing around the kindergarten playground and the bike lock-up area; and new exterior paint around the entire school. Additionally, Measure C has improved the school's infrastructure with projects such as new, environmentally efficient windows in every classroom, re-graded concrete in a number of hallways across campus, and a partially upgraded

pipe and drain system.

Collectively the scope of the Measure C projects at Lincoln has made a significant difference on our campus and in the lives of our school community. #### Quiet to Our Library, Music to Our Ears

## **Helping Districts Close the Achievement Gap**

Closing the achievement gap has rightly become a national educational imperative. It is based on the conviction – which I'm sure we all share – that education should not be a privilege for just a fortunate few, but an entitlement for all.

Closing this intolerable gap is no longer just a moral imperative. It is also an economic one, as it threatens the future of our students and the economic health and security of our nation.

But how do we accomplish this essential goal?

At LACOE, we are pursuing it in many ways—with programs that address the learning gap in public education and that promote academic success for all students. Let me highlight just a few of these:

AVID, which stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination, works to ensure that all students are given the chance to pursue and complete a college preparatory path, with special emphasis on those often overlooked both in expectations and opportunities. LACOE's AVID program currently supports about 30,000 students in more than 300 county high schools and middle schools.

LACOE has also been in the forefront in efforts to address the persistent achievement gap between English Learners and native English Speakers.

The English Learner student population in L.A. County is about a half-million nearly 30 percent of all county students. These English Learners face the daunting task of learning the academic curriculum and a new language at the same time.

LACOE's Multilingual Academic Support unit advocates for English Learners by providing research-based staff development for teachers and administrators to help them address both academic and linguistic needs.

We also provide direct technical assistance to districts on topics such as Response to Intervention for English Learners and developing a linguistically appropriate Intensive English Program for English Learners in Special Education.

And, because the achievement gap really begins with an educational opportunity gap at the earliest ages, we are committed to early literacy and school readiness.

LACOE's Head Start/Early Head Start-State Preschool program contracts with 27 agencies to provide preschool child development services for some 24,000 children countywide, making it the largest grantee program of its kind in the nation.

LACOE's Family Literacy Support Network is committed to increasing the number of quality family literacy programs serving families with very young children all across L.A. County.

LACOE has also developed a Professional Learning Community to improve instruction for African American boys, using texts that are more relevant to their culture and paying attention to their lives as a way to help improve both their reading and writing achievement.

And we will continue to work closely with our country districts to develop even more initiatives to pursue equity and excellence in education for all children. Achieving the goal will require all our best efforts - from teachers and parents to administrators and policy-makers. And our students deserve no less.
