Walking School Bus' is Making Strides

Starting in October, hundreds of elementary students and parents will again be catching the Walking School Bus in the Beach Cities.

Led by Beach Cities Health District (BCHD) – the nation's largest preventative health agency – the Walking School Bus (WSB) program allows children within a mile radius of school to meet up with classmates and BCHD-trained parent volunteers once per week at designated "bus stops," and safely walk to campus.

BCHD and Blue Zones Project launched the anti-childhood obesity initiative in 2011 and student participation has grown 500% since its inception. Presently, more than 500 children from 13 schools in Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach and Manhattan Beach are involved in the healthy walk-to-school program.



Here's a by-the-numbers look at the Walking School Bus from the 2012/2013 school year:

- **28.465.344** Steps Taken:
- **385,229** Calories Burned;
- **15,000** Car Trips Saved;
- 11,808 Miles Walked;
- 13 Participating Schools in Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach and Manhattan Beach;
- 2 City Mayors who walked with students (Mayor Mike Gin. Redondo Beach and Mayor Kit Bobko, Hermosa Beach);
- **0** WSB injuries or incidents.





We will begin the process of implementing the new Common Core State Standards in all kindergarten through twelfth grade classrooms. These learning standards for students in mathematics and language arts have been adopted by 46 states, including California. They establish clear expectations that are aligned to college and career readiness expectations. Your principal, along with your child(ren)'s classroom teachers will best be able to explain the changes in curriculum and instructional strategies that you will begin to see this school year. As California educators and students engage in this transition work, sample tests have been released to give individuals a

picture of what the new end-of-year tests will look like beginning in the 2014-2015 school year.

Childhood Cancer, What You Need to Know





Childhood cancer is rare. The odds of your child developing cancer by the age of 19, is approximately 1 in 330. Still, as a parent, you need to be aware. Cancers in children are often hard to recognize. The symptoms can overlap with common illnesses or injuries and cover the early signs of cancer.

- Childhood Cancer Signs and Symptoms:
- Continued, unexplained weight loss
- Headaches, often with early morning vomiting
- Increased swelling or persistent pain in bones, joints, back or legs
- Lump or mass, especially in the abdomen, neck, chest, pelvis or armpits
- Development of excessive bruising, bleeding or rash
- Constant infections
- A whitish color behind the pupil
- Nausea which persists or vomiting without nausea
- Constant tiredness or noticeable paleness
- Eye or vision changes which occur suddenly and persist
- Recurrent or persistent fevers of unknown origin

Make sure your child has regular medical check-ups and watch for any unusual signs or symptoms that don't go away. An early diagnosis is the best way for a child to beat a cancer diagnosis.

Tell your pediatrician if you are worried about any prolonged symptoms that your child has. Your child's doctor can work with you to assess your child's risk, by reviewing family medical history, a physical examination, or screenings.

School Funding Reform

It's a long-awaited piece of good news that Gov. Jerry Brown's newly revised budget retains his plan to direct more school money toward the areas of greatest need.

Senator Carol Liu (D-La Canada Flintridge), who was recently a guest on Schools on Point - a public affairs program produced by the Los Angeles County Office of Education - lauded the governor's plan and described it as a "huge step" in changing the way California distributes money to schools.

She said the governor aims to "clarify and simplify" school funding by doing away with layers of categorical funding requirements. The plan is to consolidate the dollars now

scattered across many programs into a single per-pupil grant. Local educators would then be able to decide how best to spend the money they get from the state to design programs that meet the specific needs of their students.

The system would also direct additional resources to schools that need them most – those serving disadvantaged students who face greater challenges, including students living in poverty, children in foster care, and English learners.

But Sen. Liu - Chair of the Senate Education Committee - also pointed out that the governor's proposal is hardly perfect. For example, it does not fully address accountability and could use constructive legislative input on some policy questions.

Senate Bill 69*, authored by Sen. Liu, outlines more specific spending plans for each grade level. It also increases funds for disadvantaged students, boosting supplemental grants from 35 to 40 percent. This means that districts would receive extra per-pupil funding at 40 percent of its base grant level for every disadvantaged student.

However, it does away with concentration grants — additional funding for districts with disadvantaged students making up more than half the student population.

SB 69 also adds teeth to the accountability measures. It requires more comprehensive data collection and requires districts to demonstrate improved outcomes for student subgroups. Districts that do not show academic progress could see spending restrictions.

The good news is no school is going to receive less money than it did for the past school year under either the governor's proposal or SB 69.

Both Gov. Brown and the senators target increased funding levels for school districts with a high number of disadvantaged students. They just differ on "how to get there," said Sen. Liu.

It's heartening to know that Sen. Liu and the other legislators are working with the governor on improving the plan and supporting a crucial reform.

As Sen. Liu said on Schools on Point: "We are moving the education agenda forward in a very, very positive way."

I'm very hopeful that the governor's initiative to reform the school funding system would lead to lasting solutions to end our education budget crisis. The devastating cuts have hurt our schools for far too long.



We have a few new administrators joining Team RBUSD:

- Dr. Tom Stekol is the new Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources. He comes to us from the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD), where he has held several positions in his nearly 25-year career. He is also a South Bay resident. Dr. Stekol replaces Dr. Nancy Kelly, who is now the Superintendent of Schools in the Upland Unified School District.
- Dr. Erik Elward is the new Director II—Educational Services. He comes to us with 16 years of experience within the LAUSD, including being a high school principal. Dr. Elward replaces Mr. Frank DeSena, who retired after 30 years in RBUSD.
- Mr. Drew Gamet is the new Madison Elementary School principal. He is a former RBUSD Board member, a former Madison parent, and a former band teacher and assistant principal in the Inglewood Unified School District. Mr. Gamet replaces Mr. Joe Ledoux, who is now a principal in Orange County.

As a parent, please pay close attention to these two words: Common Core. Common Core changes the public education landscape. With a two-and-onehalf-year-old daughter eying public school in a few short years, I am elated to see this pedagogical shift. As the Common Core goes into effect, some of the most immediate changes parents may notice, especially in the early grades, are a new emphasis on nonfiction reading and a push to get students of all ages to sharpen their analytical writing skills in all content areas. As for mathematics, the emphasis is on developing a deeper understanding of math procedures and concepts and an ability to apply different mathematical ways of thinking to real-world issues and challenges. The use of technology as a research, communication, and productivity tool will be an important component of the shift to Common Core Standards as well.

Finally, we are excited to begin our solar shade structure construction. Over the next nine months, each school site will see solar shade structures raised. This will save RBUSD's budget over \$500,000 annually, not to mention minimizing our carbon footprint. Thank you to the Redondo Beach voters for approving Measure Q, which will pay for this solar installation.

As I begin my 8th year as RBUSD's Superintendent of Schools, I want to thank you for entrusting us with your children. Team RBUSD takes its job very seriously, and we are relentless in our pursuit of providing a progressive and rigorous educational program for each student. Please do us a favor and have your children arrive at school each day on time, well nourished, and ready for the best education in the South Bay!




