





Imagine schools that are productive, harmonious centers of successful learning; where all students can thrive because they recognize themselves as capable, creative learners, self-aware human beings and compassionate, responsible citizens.

The RBUSD elementary schools have taken a bold, innovative step towards transforming its students and school culture using the MindUP curriculum. It is informed by leading edge research in the fields of developmental cognitive neuroscience, mindfulness training, social and emotional learning (SEL) and positive psychology.

It is now well established that social and emotional skills, such as the ability to manage one's emotions and get along with others, play an integral role in academic and life success. Our school-based counselors are leading the way by partnering with the teachers to integrate MindUP in all elementary classrooms throughout the school year.

How it Works

The day begins: The best teachers we know are mindful about the beginning of each school day. They start the day by greeting students as they enter the classroom, gathering them for a few moments of "check in," then followed by a core practice of deep breathing and mindful awareness. This simple routine results in a day that feels more coherent and focused, and sets an easygoing tone for engagement with the rest of the daily learning.

For transition: Our classroom transition times are some of the most important routines of the day...Our days are full, our curriculum is rich, and we have so much to do together! The tighter our transitions, the more time we will have for instruction." (Allyn, 2010).

The day ends: Jjust as teachers can help students greet a new day with eagerness and mindful purpose, so can you close the day with a spirit of purpose and celebration. The students will leave their classrooms feeling calm yet energized.

The Importance of Early Education

"When my oldest son entered kindergarten at Jefferson, nine of his classmates were friends that he had met in SBAS parent education classes. He made a very easy transition to public school. I know that I have become a better parent because of the parent education classes that I have taken. My classroom experiences have given me the confidence to stay involved as my children get older. I volunteer in my child?s classroom, the Running Club, and Hands On Art, and I will do the same for my youngest child who is currently in a SBAS pre-K class." (Suzanne Derouin, parent in the SBAS program)

Parents are the child's first and most important teacher. This might seem obvious, but it is a very important statement to us at the South Bay Adult School.

Our parent education program starts at birth and continues through the child's preschool years. SBAS currently has 900 families registered for parent education classes, and our families are involved in every class. Parent education teachers are responsible for implementing dual curriculums: early education and parent education. The curriculums are specific to the developmental age of the participating child.

Parents Getting Involved

When you visit a classroom you will see parents leading activities at tables, supervising outdoor play, serving snacks, reading to a small group of children, or sitting with the teacher in a discussion group. Families experience hands-on learning activities where the parents and children can laugh and learn together.

We know that involved parents play a key factor in student achievement and positive attitudes towards learning. We also know that our involved preschool parents will become involved parents when their children enter the elementary schools.

Next time you are at a PTA meeting, we challenge you to ask how many of the families came from the South Bay Adult School Parent Education program. You

Parent to Parent

Keeping New Year's Resolutions

Each year people make the same resolutions for the New Year. Among them are: lose weight, begin an exercise program, eat healthier, quit smoking, back up computer files, play with kids more, entertain more, volunteer more, allow for more personal time, stop drinking so much alcohol...

While this may strike a chord with you and your loved ones, why not jot down what is not only meaningful to you, but ask the whole family to join in. Each person can make up his or her own list. Discuss each list. Do not laugh or make fun of what another family member comes up with. It may seem silly to you but to them it is important.

After everyone has had a chance to contemplate their lists, add a T for True or F for False beside each one that can really be accomplished. Now, redo the list and leave off all of the false ones. We add more stress to our lives by trying to do too much too soon and end up feeling guilty and totally giving up. Take the list that you think can be realistically done and cut it into half. Now, you have a list that you can stick to and are happy about. Midway through the year, if you feel like you are ready to take on more, add the other half of the list and try to obtain those goals.

Make eating right and exercising some of the top priorities for you and the whole family. Here's a little firsthand knowledge from what I have learned by being a fitness instructor and teaching changed eating habits (healthy eating) over the last few years to women and children:

- Get a physical. This is the first thing that kids as well as adults need to do before changing their eating habits beginning an exercise program.
- Make gradual changes. Unless your doctor says otherwise, do not throw everything out at once or try to change every little bad habit in one sweep. It only creates frustration and you will end up stuffing yourself with food, and who knows what, after only a short time of your new program. This not only makes you feel bad about yourself and make you feel like a failure, but your body can have an instant reaction in weight gain, water retention, bloating and/or upset stomach.
- Have a least one bite of a forbidden treat every other day. This will suffice in a low calorie or sugar free candy in your favorite flavor.
- Have whatever you want for one meal once a month. If you are working out
 on a regular basis, do not cut your carbs in half and go ahead and eat your
 favorite meal, maybe with smaller portions, at least once a month. Children
 as well as adults need carbs while in an exercise program or strenuous
 sports or activities.
- Include weight training, which also goes by the term, "strength training," with your exercise program. If your child is under the age of twelve, do not allow weight training.






