Recognizing Gastrointestinal (GI) Conditions in Your Child

Pediatric gastrointestinal (GI) conditions affect a child's gastrointestinal tract, or organs of the digestive system, which include the esophagus, stomach, large and small bowel, liver, gallbladder and pancreas.

Millions of children are living with pediatric digestive and nutritional disorders. Some of the most common conditions, include:

- Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD) GERD is a chronic disease which occurs when stomach acid or stomach contents flow back into the food pipe. More than 7 million people in the U.S. have some symptoms of GERD.
- **Crohn's Disease** is a type of inflammatory bowel disease. It causes inflammation of the digestive tract lining. The rate of which Crohn's disease is occurring in children has nearly doubled over the last decade.

• Celiac Disease is an autoimmune condition brought on by ingesting gluten, which is a protein in wheat and many other grains. It is estimated that approximately 1 in 500 people in the U.S. have celiac disease.

GI conditions make themselves known in different ways, but there are five common signs that your child could have a gastrointestinal condition:

- Vomiting
- Recurrent abdominal pain
- Alternation of routine bowel patterns, such as constipation or diarrhea
- Abdominal distention (belly swelling)
- Burping and heartburn

If you recognize these signs in your child, they may need a referral to a pediatric gastroenterologist.

GGUSD Begins School Year with Exciting New Programs

A new school year always brings a sense of excitement and renewal – for students and school district employees. Over the summer, many of our educators invested in professional development that will allow them to improve instructional strategies and student results in the classroom. Our Facilities teams completed many modernization projects, including installing air conditioning in five more elementary schools, completing the stunning Michael A. Monsoor Memorial Stadium, and renovating our Don Wash Auditorium, among others.

We have our data from the state SBAC testing system, CAASPP. GGUSD's test scores show positive growth across all content areas and grade levels. Our students continue to outperform the state average on these standardardized tests and our district ranks number one among larger urban districts in California across most grade levels.

At Garden Grove Unified School District (GGUSD), we know that test scores only tell part of the story and we will continue to focus on what is in our control: providing our students with a worldclass education and focusing on the whole child. This year, we have increased mental health services and supports for students at all levels. Supporting our students also often means supporting the whole family. To that end, in August, we opened our first Family Resource Center. In collaboration

with local social service agencies and non-profits, it provides one-stop referrals from our trusted community partners in areas like physical and mental health, legal aid, and immigration assistance.

Our annual student survey data revealed that students want additional help building skills around scholarly habits and motivation. Too many students admit to not knowing how to study or feel they cannot learn a certain subject when it doesn't come easy. To address the needs of

our students, GGUSD put together a working group of instructional leaders from across the district to develop the FAR model. It is a conceptual framework that helps teachers improve instructional strategies that teach students to Focus, Act, and Reflect. These strategies around growth mindset and motivation will help students develop the personal skills needed for success.

Our schools are also focused on ensuring students are college and career ready. Of the 3,300 seniors who graduated with the Class of 2017, 53 percent met rigorous college entrance requirements (a-g requirements) qualifying them to attend UC and CSU schools. Our a-g rates are higher than the county and state average. Last year, our more than 1,600 seniors took 4,000 Advanced Placement Courses and nearly 550 students earned the

Seal of Biliteracy and have become fluent in two or more

languages. Our average AP scores rank higher than the state, country, and world average.

New in 2017-18, GGUSD opened a Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion program at Murdy Elementary School for transitional kindergarten students. This makes GGUSD the second district in Orange County and fourth in the nation to offer such a program. Our Spanish dual immersion program

at Monroe Elementary Language Academy is in its second year and is experiencing tremendous success with its now $300 \; \text{students}.$

It's my fifth year as superintendent of GGUSD and each year brings new challenges and new successes. But what remains the same is the hard work and dedication of our staff, students, and parents as we work collaboratively to ensure lifelong success for our students: that's the Garden Grove Way.

El GGUSD inicia un nuevo año escolar con nuevos y emocionantes programas escolares

Un nuevo año escolar siempre nos trae un sentido de entusiasmo y renovación- tanto para los estudiantes como para los empleados del Distrito Escolar. Durante el verano, muchos de nuestros maestros invirtieron su tiempo en asistir a talleres de desarrollo profesional, los cuales les permitirán mejorar sus estrategias de instrucción y los resultados de los estudiantes en el salón de clases. Nuestros equipos de Servicios de Infraestructura, finalizaron muchos de los proyectos de modernización, incluyendo la instalación del sistema de aire acondicionado en cinco escuelas primarias más, y finalizando el impresionante Estadio Conmemorativo Michael A. Monsoor, y la renovación de nuestro Auditorio Don Wash, entre otros más.

Nosotros obtuvimos nuestros datos del SBAC y del CAASPP. Los puntajes de los exámenes del GGUSD, muestran un incremento positivo en todas las áreas de contenido y niveles de grado. Nuestros estudiantes continúan superando al promedio estatal en estos exámenes estandarizados, y nuestro Distrito ocupa el primer lugar entre los distritos urbanos más grandes de California, en la mayoría de los niveles de grado.

En el Distrito, sabemos que los puntajes de los exámenes solamente relatan parte de la historia, y por eso continuaremos enfocándonos en lo que está bajo nuestro control: proporcionándoles a nuestros estudiantes una educación de primera clase y enfocándonos totalmente en el desarrollo integral del niño. Este año, hemos aumentado los servicios de salud mental y el apoyo para nuestros estudiantes en todos los niveles. El apoyar a nuestros estudiantes a menudo también significa apoyar a toda la familia. Con ese objetivo, en el mes de agosto abrimos nuestro primer Centro de Recursos para Familias. En colaboración con los servicios sociales y agencias sin fines de lucro locales, este centro proporciona recomendaciones de nuestros socios comunitarios más confiables, en un solo lugar en áreas como la salud mental y física, ayuda legal y asistencia con asuntos de inmigración.

Los datos de nuestra encuesta anual, revelaron que los estudiantes quieren recibir ayuda adicional para desarrollar habilidades relacionadas con la motivación y los hábitos escolares. Demasiados estudiantes admiten que no saben cómo estudiar o piensan que no pueden aprender una cierta materia, cuando no la entienden fácilmente. Para abordar las necesidades de nuestros estudiantes, el GGUSD formó un grupo de trabajo con líderes educativos de todo el Distrito, para desarrollar el modelo para Enfocarse, Actuar y Reflexionar. Este modelo es un marco de referencia, que ayuda a que los maestros mejoren sus estrategias de instrucción para enseñarles a los estudiantes a Enfocarse, Actuar y Reflexionar. GGUSD Khai Giảng Niên Học Với Những Chương Trình Mới Thật Hào Hứng

Đối với các em học sinh và nhân viên học khu, mùa tưu trường luôn đi cùng với sư hào hứng khi trở lai trường để bước vào một niên học mới. Trong mùa hè, nhiều giáo viên của chúng tôi đã tham gia chương trình tu nghiệp chuyên môn để thăng tiến các phương pháp giảng day nhằm nâng cao thành quả học tập của học sinh. Nhóm đặc trách về cơ sở vật chất của chúng tôi đã hoàn thành nhiều dự án tân trang, kể cả việc gắn máy lanh cho thêm năm trường tiểu học, hoàn tất việc tân trang sân vân đông thật tân kỳ để tưởng nhớ cưu học sinh, Michael A. Monsoor và Thính đường Don Wash Auditorium, cùng những dự án khác.

Dưa theo dữ liêu báo cáo điểm khảo sát kỳ thi tiểu bang SBAC, CAASPP, điểm thi của học sinh GGUSD cho thấy sư tiến bộ khả quan về mọi lãnh vực của học sinh thuộc các cấp lớp. Các học sinh của chúng ta tiếp tục vượt trên tỉ lê trung bình của học sinh trong tiểu bang qua các kỳ thi tiêu chuẩn và học khu chúng ta được xếp hạng nhất khi so sánh với những học khu thành thị lớn hơn trong tiểu California về thành tích của đa số các cấp lớp.

Tai Khu Hoc Chính Garden Grove (GGUSD), chúng ta biết rằng điểm thi chỉ nói lên một phần và chúng tôi sẽ tiếp tục đặt trọng tâm vào những điều có thể thực hiện được trong khả năng của mình: cung cấp cho các em học sinh một nền giáo dục có tầm cỡ quốc tế và chú trọng vào việc giáo dục học sinh một cách toàn diện. Năm nay, chúng tôi có thêm các dịch vụ sức khoẻ tâm thần và hỗ trơ học sinh thuộc mọi cấp lớp. Việc hỗ trợ học sinh thường đồng nghĩa với việc hỗ trợ cả gia đình các em. Với mục đích đó, vào tháng 8, Trung Tâm Hỗ Trợ Gia Đình đầu tiên của chúng ta đã được thành lập. Với sự hợp tác của các cơ quan xã hôi trong địa phương và các cơ quan bất vu lợi, nơi đây sẽ giới thiệu những ai cần được giúp đỡ đến thẳng những cơ quan hợp tác tin cậy trong cộng đồng về những lãnh vực liên quan đến sức khoẻ tâm thần hay thể chất, trơ giúp về luật pháp và di trú.

Dữ liệu thăm dò ý kiến nhận xét của học sinh hằng năm cho thấy các học sinh của chúng ta muốn được giúp đỡ thêm về cách rèn luyên các thói quen học hành chăm chỉ và đông cơ thúc đẩy học tập. Còn rất nhiều học sinh thừa nhận rằng các em vẫn chưa biết cách học bài hay không thể học một môn nào khi cảm thấy môn đó hơi khó hiểu. Để đáp ứng nhu cầu của con em hoc sinh chúng ta, GGUSD đã lập một ban giảng huấn cho toàn học khu để khai triển mô hình 'FAR', một khuôn mẫu dựa trên khái niệm để dạy học sinh biết Chuyên chú 'Focus', Thực hành 'Act' và Suy ngẫm 'Reflect' và giúp giáo viên thăng tiến phương pháp giảng dạy. Những phương pháp này xoay quanh tinh thần cầu tiến và động lực thúc đẩy sẽ giúp học sinh phát triển năng lực cá nhân cần thiết để thành công.

Các trường học của chúng ta cũng chú trong vào việc chuẩn bị cho con em học sinh sẵn sàng vào đại học và chọn ngành nghề. Trong số 3,300 học sinh lớp 12 tốt nghiệp niên khoá 2017, 53 % đáp ứng những yêu cầu khó khăn (các lớp bắt buộc a-g)

GGUSD Unveils New Michael A. Monsoor Memorial Stadium

Our Board of Education was so pleased to host a special ceremony on September 8th to unveil the brand new athletic stadium named in honor of Michael A. Monsoor, a 1999 Garden Grove High School graduate, tight-end on the school's football team, elite Navy SEAL, and posthumous Congressional Medal of Honor recipient. Petty Officer Monsoor sacrificed his life in 2006 while serving in Iraq by jumping on a live grenade to save two of his SEAL teammates.

The event was a spectacular tribute to the life, service and sacrifice of Michael A. Monsoor. The home stands were filled to capacity with nearly 3,000 people attending the ceremony, including elected officials, the captain and crew of the guided missile destroyer USS Michael Monsoor (DDG-1001), Gold Star Parents, Garden Grove High School alumni, community members, and friends and family of Monsoor.



The entire evening was action packed and emotionally moving. As athletes from the three schools who share the stadium unveiled the Navy SEAL trident on the field's 50-yard line and former Navy SEALs from the Patriot Parachute Team skydived onto the field while waving large American flags.

Pacifica's Navy JROTC hoisted up the flag as Garden Grove High School's Vocal Ensemble performed the National Anthem.

Jason Booher, the founder and first commander of the Navy SEAL unit in Ramadi, Iraq, where Monsoor gave his Following the dedication, Garden Grove High School took the field for their long awaited first home game of the season against the Woodbridge High School Warriors. The state-of-the-art stadium features 4,000 seats, synthetic turf field, a nine-lane synthetic track, energy-efficient lighting, LED scoreboard, well-appointed press box, new restrooms, ticket booths, and a concession stand that honors Monsoor with a plaque describing his heroic actions.

Of course, we would like to thank our community for this amazing new venue as it was made possible in part by Measure P, the district's \$311 million bond measure which received 76.3% approval from voters in November.

El GGUSD inauguró su nuevo estadio en homenaje a Michael A. Monsoor

A la Mesa Directiva de Educación le complació mucho patrocinar una ceremonia especial, el 8 de septiembre, para inaugurar el nuevo estadio atlético nombrado en homenaje a Michael A. Monsoor, un graduado de la Escuela Secundaria Garden Grove en 1999, quién además jugó como ala cerrada (tight-end) de fútbol americano para el equipo de su escuela secundaria, fue seleccionado por las Fuerzas de Operaciones Especiales de la Marina de EE.UU. (Navy SEAL) y ganador póstumo de la Medalla de Honor del Congreso. El Suboficial Monsoor sacrificó su vida en el año 2006 mientras servía en Irak, al tirarse sobre una granada a punto de estallar, para así salvarles la vida a dos de sus compañeros de la Marina Navy SEAL.

La ceremonia fue un tributo maravilloso de la vida, servicio y sacrificio de Michael A. Monsoor. Las gradas estaban completamente llenas, con casi 3,000 personas que asistieron a la ceremonia, incluyendo funcionarios electos, el capitán y la tripulación del destructor de misiles guiados Michael Monsoor (DDG-1001), padres de familia Gold Star, exalumnos de la Escuela Secundaria Garden Grove, miembros de la comunidad, y los amigos y familiares de Monsoor.

Toda la tarde fue conmovedora y llena de acción. Mientras los atletas de las tres escuelas que comparten el estadio revelaron el tridente de la Navy SEAL, en la línea de 50 yardas del campo, antiguos miembros de la Navy SEAL del Equipo de Paracaídas Patrióticas se tiraban en paracaídas al campo, mientras ondeaban banderas grandes de los EE.UU.

El programa naval de JROTC, de la Escuela Secundaria Pacifica, izó la bandera mientras el grupo vocal de la Escuela Secundaria Garden Grove cantaba el himno nacional.

Jason Booher, el fundador y primer comandante de la unidad de Navy SEAL en Ramadi (Irak), donde Monsoor sacrificó su vida, dio un discurso sobresaliente e incluyó unas palabras emotivas de ánimo para el equipo de fútbol americano de la Escuela Secundaria Garden Grove, el cual estaba escuchando atentamente desde atrás en la zona de anotación. El presidente de nuestra Mesa Directiva de Educación, Lan Nguyen le presentó a la mamá de Monsoor, la Sra. Sally Monsoor, un casco de fútbol americano firmado por los anteriores compañeros de fútbol de su hijo.

El gran final fue cuando los pilotos de los helicópteros de Navy Seahawk realizaron un espectáculo aéreo que retumbaba por encima de todos los presentes del estadio mientras ellos se pusieron de pie y les aclamaron con entusiasmo.

Después de la dedicación, la Escuela Secundaria Garden Grove salió al campo para su anhelado primer partido del equipo local de la temporada, contra los Warriors de la Escuela Secundaria Woodbridge. El estadio de última generación cuenta con 4,000 asientos, campo de césped artificial, hipódromo de material sintético, iluminación de bajo consumo, tanteador LED, cabina de prensa bien equipada, taquillas y baños nuevos, y un puesto de comida

Vào ngày 8 tháng 9, Hôi Đồng Giáo Duc của chúng ta có vinh dự được tổ chức buổi lễ đặc biệt để khánh thành sân vận động hoàn toàn mới, được đặt tên là Michael A. Monsoor để vinh danh cựu học sinh tốt nghiệp Trường Trung Học Cấp II Garden Grove niên khoá 1999, một trung phong trong đội banh bầu dục của trường, một thành viên Lực Lượng Người Nhái Đặc Biệt và là một anh hùng được truy tặng Danh Dự Bội Tinh của Quốc hội. Vào năm 2006 khi phục vụ tại Irag, hạ sĩ quan Monsoor nhảy chồm người lên trái lựu đạn sắp nổ để cứu hai đồng đội người nhái của mình.

Buổi lễ truy điệu trọng thể nhằm tỏ lòng tưởng nhớ đến Michael A. Monsoor, đã hy sinh cuộc sống mình vì lý tưởng dấn thân phục vụ. Gần 3000 người tham dự ngồi kín khán đài, trong đó có các viên chức dân cử, thuyền trưởng và toán phụ trách phi đạn điều khiển khu trục hạm USS Michael Monsoor (DDG-1001), các phụ huynh Gold Star, cựu học sinh Trường Trung Học Cấp II Garden Grove, các thành viên trong cộng đồng, cùng gia đình và bạn hữu của Monsoor.

Trọn chương trình buổi tối lần lượt diễn ra chan hoà với những cảm xúc. Phần khánh thành huy hiệu Người Nhái ngay giữa sân cỏ do các học sinh chơi thể thao của ba trường dùng chung sân vận động này thực hiện. Cựu thành viên Đội Nhảy Dù thuộc Lực Lượng Người Nhái nhảy xuống sân vận đông với lá đại kỳ Nước Mỹ.

Đơn vị Huấn Luyện Sĩ Quan Hải Quân Trừ Bị (JROTC) tại Trường Trung Học Pacifica dương cao quốc kỳ trong lúc Ban Hợp Xướng Trường Trung Học Garden Grove trình diễn bài quốc ca.

Ông Jason Booher, người thành lập và chỉ huy trưởng đầu tiên của đơn vị Người Nhái tại Ramadi, Iraq, nơi Monsoor đã hy sinh tính mạng, đọc phần phát biểu rất cảm động cùng với những lời khuyến khích thật chân thành dành cho đôi banh bầu dục Garden Grove ngồi chăm chú lắng nghe ở cuối sân. Chủ tịch Hội Đồng Giáo Dục, Luật Sư Nguyễn Quốc Lân, trao quà lưu niệm cho bà Sally Monsoor, mẹ của Michael, chiếc nón của đội banh có chữ ký của các đồng đội cũ của Michael.





Nuestras escuelas también se enfocan en asegurar que los estudiantes estén preparados para la Universidad y una carrera profesional. De los 3,300 estudiantes del doceavo grado que se graduaron con la Clase del 2017, el 53 por ciento de ellos cumplieron con los rigurosos requisitos de admisión para la Mafi Universidad (a-g requirements), calificándolos para asistir a las Universidades de UC y CSU. Nuestros tasas a-g son más altas que las del promedio del condado y del estado. El año pasado, más de 1,600 de nuestros estudiantes del doceavo grado, tomaron 4,000 clases AP y casi 550 estudiantes obtuvieron el Sello de Alfabetización Bilingüe, y se convirtieron en estudiantes con dominio fluido en dos o más idiomas. Camp songs are very dear to Ella Jenkins, the national children's-singalong treasure who at 93 is still performing. She cherished songs that her brother brought home from Boy Scouts and had always wanted to record a camp-song CD.

For this project, Jenkins assembled a literal band of brothers and sisters who have




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
