N-MUSD's districtwide
graduation rate increased

graduation rate increased to 94.8% in 2009-10 from 93.2% in 2008-09.

One campus, Early College High School, had a rare-for-Orange County 100% graduation rate, according to data from the state Department of Education released on August 11, 2011. Overall, Newport-Mesa students graduate at a higher rate than the countywide average of 87.5% and significantly higher than the statewide average, 80.4%.

Assistant Superintendent of Secondary Education Dr. Charles Hinman said the data came as no surprise with Newport-Mesa's tradition of achieving high graduation rates. "I'm thrilled," he said. "It's

Newport-Mesa's Graduation Rate Continues to Score Above County and State Averages

En general, los estudiantes de Newport-Mesa se graduaron a un índice más alto que el promedio de 87.5% de todo el condado y significantemente más alto que el promedio de 80.4% de todo el estado.

El Superintendente Adjunto de Educación Secundaria Dr. Charles Hinman dijo que la información no es sorpresa debido a que tradicionalmente Newport-Mesa logra altos de

### What's With All the Construction on the Campuses of CMHS and CdMHS?

Improvements for N-MUSD kids! That's what's happening on the campuses of Costa Mesa High/Middle School and Corona del Mar High/Middle School. It will take N-MUSD about three years and \$31 million in Measure F Bond funds to complete, but the end result is expected to please many whose wish lists included a place for middle school students to call their own on 7th to 12thgrade campuses. The projects, better known as the "enclaves" will include state-of-the-art classrooms and will allow a space for students to gather separately from the high school areas. The new classrooms, including exploratory labs with space to work on oversized projects, will allow for learning with the latest technology. The project also includes a theater at each school. Construction should be complete in 24 to 36 months.

Voters approved the \$282 million Measure F in 2005 with the condition they would be paying no more than

El proyecto también incluye un teatro en cada escuela. Completar la construcción tomará de 24 a 36 meses.

### **Backflow Device Thefts are on the Rise!**

Recently, water backflow devices and fireline meters have become targets of thieves. These devices are important to maintaining water system quality and can be expensive to repair or replace.

Mesa Consolidated Water District (Mesa Water) alerts you to take precautions to protect these devices from theft and damage. In most cases, commercially available enclosures provide enough security to deter theft.

Other deterrents to theft are:

- increased lighting
- trimmed landscaping
- security and/or video surveillance

There are also local companies that specialize in backflow device theft protection.

If you observe a theft in progress, please call 911 immediately. If your device is stolen or damaged, Mesa Water encourages you to file a report with your local police department.

### Prepare, Plan with your Family

This September will mark the ten year anniversary of 9/11 and we ask you to take time to remember those lost as well as time to make sure you are prepared for future emergencies. September is National Preparedness Month (NPM), which was founded after 9/11 to increase preparedness in the U.S. It is a time to prepare yourself and those in your care for an unexpected emergency.

Emergencies can happen anytime and anywhere. If you've seen the news recently, you know that emergencies can happen unexpectedly in communities and families just like yours. This September, please prepare in the event your family must go for a few days without electricity, water service, access to a supermarket or local services. Just follow these three steps: Get a Kit. Make a Plan. Be informed.

#### **Get a Kit**

Keep enough emergency supplies on hand for your family – water, non-perishable food, first aid, prescriptions, flashlight, and a battery-powered radio. If you own pets, remember to include their food and supplies in your supply kit. The Ready Kids family-friendly website (Ready.gov/kids) features instructions on what families and teachers can do to prepare for emergencies and the role kids can play in that effort. Spanish material is available at Listo Niños (Listo.gov).

#### Make a Plan

Discuss and agree on an emergency plan with your family. You can download the Family Emergency Plan at Ready.gov/makeaplan.

#### **Be Informed**

In addition to the Ready.gov site, free information is available from your city to assist you. Contact your local emergency manager to get details on specific hazards in your area, free training, local plans for shelter and evacuation, ways to get specific information before and during an emergency, and how to sign up to receive emergency alerts if they are available.

Consider planning a *Ready Kids* event in your community to encourage other families to remember, and prepare. Sample activities that are great for schools, scouts and other youth groups include:

- Helping Girl Scouts & Boy Scout work towards achieving their new Preparedness Patch
- Volunteering to present preparedness information in your child's class or in PTO/PTA meetings
- Inviting officials from your local Office of Emergency Management, Citizen Corps Council, or first responder teams to speak at schools or youth events

### **Safeguard Yourself from Identity Theft (Part 1)**





You or someone you know may have experienced some form of identity theft, which is one of the fastest growing crimes in the United States with millions of victims each year. Identity theft is serious. One can spend hundreds of dollars and countless hours plus frustrations repairing their good credit and clearing their name. Below are ways your identity can be stolen:

Phishing –attempts to fraudulently acquire sensitive personal
information (ie. account numbers, passwords, social security
numbers, credit card details, etc) through email fraud or
internet scams. In a typical case, phishing involves the use of
email messages impersonating your financial institution, a
reputable company that you normally conduct business with

or a government agency. Phishing emails always have a sense of urgency. The email will probably warn you of a serious problem that requires your immediate attention. It will then urge you to click on a button or link where you will be asked to enter or confirm your personal information.

- **Dumpster Diving** –thieves will rummage through trash looking for bills or other documents with your personal information on it that you have mistakenly thrown in the trash instead of shredding.
- **Skimming** –thieves can procure a victim's credit card number using basic methods such as photocopying receipts or by using a more advanced method such as a small electronic device (skimmer) to swipe and store hundreds of credit card or debit/ATM card numbers, which reads the magnetic strip as the user unknowingly passes their card through it.
- **Pretexting** –the practice of using false pretenses to obtain personal information. Pretexters sell your information to people who may use it to get credit in your name, to steal your assets, to investigate or sue you.



### **Establishing a Routine**

One of several issues child advocates are concerned about these days is that children are not getting enough sleep at night. A regular bedtime is essential to the health and growth of your child.

If eight o'clock is the child's bedtime, it is made clear that there is no room service or further negotiating after eight. "I am done with my mothering/fathering for today. Your job is to get some sleep. Once I leave the room, any requests, complaints or fooling around noise will cost you fifteen minutes off of when you go to be tomorrow night. Two complaints means you go to bed tomorrow night at seven thirty. It is time to sleep. I will be glad to see you tomorrow." Hugs and kisses are given and the

line drawn in the sand-no more communication.

Children need a regular study time each day. This is sometimes difficult with the multiple interruptions provided by the after school extra curricular schedule. To the extent the time is regular will the child be able to adapt to doing the work at hand.

With a child who has trouble focusing, it is best to have the child show you what the homework is and then show you what he/she has accomplished at the end of the homework period. Tell the child up-front that work must be legible (Your teacher will love you for this one!) and the work must be done. Work that is not legible will be copied over.

Keep an eye on your child's progress. Too many children flounder in school and then don't have the initiative or skills to catch up again. Ask the teachers for a grade report long before the school schedule provides one. Let the teachers know you will support them and that you want to know if your child slips behind. A letter to the teacher might say, "Thank you for choosing to teach school. We want our son/daughter to be successful this semester and request that you let us know if he/she begins to fall behind, not do homework or otherwise fail to do his/her job in school. Thank you for your time and caring."

Inspire your child, help your child and do not do for your child what he/she needs to learn to do for self. As a former classroom teacher, I can tell you that it is easy to spot work that is done by a parent, not the child. This is especially true with projects. When one California mission is crudely glued together with popsicle sticks and another one has architectural design involved, a teacher knows that the parent probably took over the project.

Working together on a project is great fun, and it is important not to take the "child" out of the project. A good grade is not as important as a sense of doing something yourself. And, if the child puts off a project let him/her fail. Failing is an important lesson that inspires a child to make better choices. Rescuing a child does not teach responsibility.


Most important, make it clear that your child has two jobs in your home: (1) to be a good human being and (2) to do his/her best in school.



exciting, but we've been celebrating that for some time."

In June of 2010, *The Christian Science Monitor* published a study that reported on graduation rates across the United States. The report identified 21 big-city "overachievers" that posted much higher graduation rates than would be expected based on a range of factors including demographics and poverty. Newport-Mesa was one of five such districts that outpaced expectations by 18 percentage points or more.

"When the school board hired me... they said, 'We don't want to lose one single student,' " says Newport-Mesa Superintendent Dr. Jeffrey Hubbard. "Students who are struggling in our comprehensive high schools have other alternatives," he says, including hands-on classes at community colleges, where they can simultaneously work toward an associate's degree.

Every Newport-Mesa school scored higher than both the state and county rates. Hinman attributed the district's achievement to the school board's expectation that every student should succeed. The board's adamant belief set a target for staff, he said.

Early College had the highest rate of success, with every student in its first senior class graduating, according to the data. "That's outstanding, absolutely, and they're a model of what we should all work toward," Hinman said.

they were for Measure A, approved in 2000. Newport-Mesa residents pay about \$19 per \$100,000 of their tax assessment to support the bond. Thanks to the support of the Newport-Mesa community, the Measure F bond has already funded the gymnasium at TeWinkle Middle School, the Jim Scott Stadium at Estancia High School, the renovation of the Newport Harbor High School Robins/Loats Building and Wentz Theater, and most recently, the aquatic center at Costa Mesa High School.

The District's goal with any construction project is to maintain safety and limit disruption to the school sites and neighboring communities.

Space availability on each campus has determined the location of the projects. The majority of Costa Mesa's project will occur at the far end of the campus closest to the fairgrounds. While, Corona del Mar's project will occur more central to the campus. These are going to be challenging projects to complete with the space available. Inevitably, both campuses and communities will encounter some issues with traffic, parking and unforeseen issues when large school-wide events occur. En junio de 2010, el periódico *The Christian Science Monitor* publicó un estudio que reportó los índices de graduación de todo los Estados Unidos. El reporte identificó a 21 ciudades grandes "overachievers" (que sacan resultados mejor que lo esperado) que obtuvieron índices de graduación más altos de lo que se esperaría con base en una gama de factores que incluyen demografía y pobreza. Newport-Mesa es uno de los cinco distritos que han sobrepasado las expectativas con un porcentaje de 18 o más puntos.
