Interventions for Program Improvement Schools -Camp Mesa and Eagle Academy Summer Reading Programs Show Exceptional Attendance

This summer, Newport-Mesa Unified offered a unique summer reading academy. Camp Mesa at Costa Mesa High School and The Eagles Academy at Estancia High School ran for five weeks, four days a week, from 8:20 a.m. to 12:20 p.m. The program was designed to assist students in grades 4-6 from the district's program improvement schools and students in grades 4-10 who were reading two grade levels or more below expectations. School Smarts

Back to School



The period just before a new school year can be as stressful as it is exciting, for both students and parents. Start your school year with less anxiety:

Start preparing for the first day of school 10-14 days ahead of time. This amount of time allows students to complete (or start!) any summer work that was assigned, complete school-related shopping trips and for students' bodies to acclimate to "school year" routines.

Talk with your child to gauge sources of excitement and anxiety. Getting to know your child's apprehensions makes you aware of

potential triggers and better allows you to coach him/her. Having this knowledge will also allow you to communicate with his/her teacher better should a situation arise.

Use the new school year for a new start. Encourage your child to enter the new year without any old baggage (conflicts with classmates, apprehensions about academics, etc.) Help your child learn the lifelong lesson on how to use time as a healer.

Prepare your child for major changes, especially if your child is transitioning to a new school. Every new school year holds changes and change can cause anxiety. You can help address questions and ease your child's fear. An older student can serve as a mentor, answer any 'technical' questions and provide your child a peer/ 'in house' expert.

Prepare yourself financially for the start of school. Starting a new school year is expensive! Request the school supply list ahead of time. Calculate additional classroom costs (projects, fieldtrips, uniforms etc) and optional choices (sports, scouts, lunch, etc) to budget and talk with your children ahead of time about their choices.

Go through steps 1-4 above for yourself. As a parent, you have your own set of emotions about sending your children back to school and working through your anxiety allows you to be best prepared to help your child.

Rajeshri holds a BS from the University of Michigan and a MA in School of Leadership with Principal Certification from Harvard University. Make Believers, 23 Skidoo



The title of this inventive collection of contemporary musical styles may be initially deceptive—none of the songs, even the one about "Jack and the Beanstalk," concern fantasy play. Instead, they're vehicles and metaphors intended to make believers out of children—believers in themselves.

The performer and writer of the songs, hip hop artist Secret Agent 23 Skidoo, has gathered an ensemble of musicians that include vocalists from indie bands, his wife and his preteen daughter. The instrumental backup features horns from tuba to

trumpet, great percussion, and strings, including an appearance by indie-folk cellist Ben Sollee. The songs, all penned by Skidoo, concern the issues that preadolescents encounter as they prepare to face the world. They are written as much for parental enlightenment as for a motive force for young people.

"Gotta Be You" deals with issues of popularity. The song, scatted by Skidoo's daughter, Sati, takes the cliché out of "Be your own best friend." The doo wop-infused "Nightmares Disappear" lifts the fear from the night, leaving only its beauty and the security of a safe adult. "Snowforts and Sandcastles," a gorgeous and radiohit-worthy number, can best be described as a double monologue of melody and hip hop. "High Five for the High Dive" not only sends the guys off into summer but also revels in the bravery "from the wading pool to the high dive, so high that it looks like a sky dive." And the trip back to school will come up before they rinse the last drop of chlorine from their swimsuits—"Back Home" traces the first day in a new school as related by a nervous student to his best friend, the dog.

Adolescence can be a difficult period and one during which children and parents may find communication difficult. To this purpose, and in another play on words, Make Believers works as a musical bridge. Available on Underground Playground Records.

Back to school also means back to the library. So this fall, the Newport Beach Public Library has added some new resources for students, teachers and parents.

The Accelerated Readers levels are now searchable! Students in the AR program can now search books by level to see how many points are assigned to each. In the Library catalog, just look for the "Reading Level" link on the left side of the page. AR levels are searched by a decimal number that indicates the grade level and month. For example, 3.4 is the third grade, fourth month. AR information will be updated twice a year, and new titles added in

The children's department has put together several booklists to help find books of interest. The lists for school-age children include grade level, genre fiction, award winners, read-alikes and non-fiction categories. For picture books, we have favorites, life changes and character building.

The library's newest database is the National Geographic Magazine Archive. It includes every page and photograph the magazine published between 1888 and 1994. Other useful databases include the Biography Resource Center, which features biographies on famous people from various print resources; CultureGrams, which provides concise cultural and statistical reports on over 200 countries; Ancient History and Culture, an overview of ancient civilizations with text, pictures, timelines and maps; and Kids InfoBits, where you can browse and search magazine and newspaper articles in a child-friendly interface.



Here are some of the things that should be considered:


- First of all, economic development is one byproduct of libraries and in many cities is the central venue for workforce training, career planning and job-



The summer program is only the beginning of changes at the program improvement schools. During the summer program, students were introduced to Language!, a different curriculum than what students have been taught throughout the year. It is designed to meet students' specific needs and catch them up to district standards. The summer program was intended to "jump start" the year. The majority of the Language! Program will be implemented in September and throughout the 2012/13 school year.

The schools sent out invitations and hoped for and strongly encouraged attendance by the identified students. But how many kids would actually attend and give up 20 days of their summer was the lurking question on July 16 as the program opened its doors.

They came...and they kept coming, faithfully, for five weeks. Camp Mesa had over 300 students attend the summer program. The Eagle Academy welcomed over 450 students to their campus.

A critical part of the program was to determine effectiveness. At the beginning and end of the program, students were given fluency tests. The preliminary results are in!

45% of the students in 4th, 5th and 6th grade advanced at least one grade level of skills. Using the Language! curriculum students achieved the following results:

Eagle Academy at Estancia High School

4th grade (2 months growth) 5th grade (5 months growth) 6th grade (7 months growth)

Camp Mesa at Costa Mesa High School

4th grade (7 months growth) 5th grade (6 months growth) 6th grade (8 months growth)

Congratulations to the staff and students who participated in the summer academies. 20 days of their summer dedicated to teaching and learning and the results of their efforts show!
