Banning Unified School District, one of the oldest districts in Riverside County, serves a three hundred square mile area. It encompasses Cabazon, White Water, Poppet Flats, and the Morongo Indian Reservation, as well as the city of Banning. The San Geronio School District was formed in 1877 and later became the Banning Unified School District. There were 14 children enrolled when the first school opened in a one-room shack. The school moved several times and burned to the ground once before 1907 when a new stucco building was built on Williams Street and a separate high school was started. The Williams Street building is still in use as the Banning district office and administration center.

The district educates approximately 5,000 students enrolled in kindergarten through twelfth grade. Banning Unified School District has four elementary schools, one intermediate school, one middle school, one comprehensive high school, one continuation high school and one independent study school. The district is one of the largest employers in the city of Banning with approximately 570 employees.

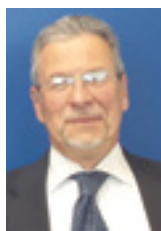

Hemet Unified School District is one of the largest geographic areas of any district in California. It serves a growing community with a current enrollment of 21,000 students. We offer preschool centers at nine school locations, eleven elementary schools (K-5), three elementary/middle schools (K-8), four middle schools (6-8), four comprehensive high schools (9-12), one continuation high school (11-12), one community day school (9-12), a science-based charter middle/high school (6-12), an adult education center, Independent Study Programs, a Home School Program, and a self-paced online instruction program to provide a wide variety of learning opportunities for our students.

Forces of Change

Two forces are changing the course of education this year and beyond. Last November, the voting majority forcefully said “yes” to LEUSD’s \$105 million school bond to implement cutting-edge technology and repair our local schools to support student college and career success. The Measure V bond program will benefit all LEUSD schools, not just a few. Measure V will have lasting impact on LEUSD’s quality of education over the next 30-40 years.

The second force for change is a result of the new California Assessment of Student Performance & Progress (CAASPP). Student test scores under CAASPP were released in September. Our students did well overall; proficiency in English Language

Arts and Mathematics increased. While we celebrate improved student achievement, CAASPP data enables improved instruction through common assessments within our teacher-led Professional Learning Communities, or PLC teams. Using CAASPP data, PLC teams now focus on four questions: What do we want each student to learn? How will we know when each student has learned it? How will we respond when a student experiences difficulty in learning? How can we enrich and extend their learning when they already know it? The desired outcome is improving student achievement, while closing the achievement gap between student subgroups, to meet state and district Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) goals.

Continuing our teacher collaboration on instructional “best practices,” and the successful passage of Measure V, will enable LEUSD to make meaningful strides in maintaining schools as safe and effective places of learning!
