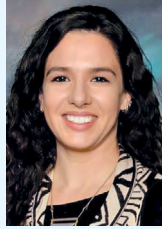

State Testing

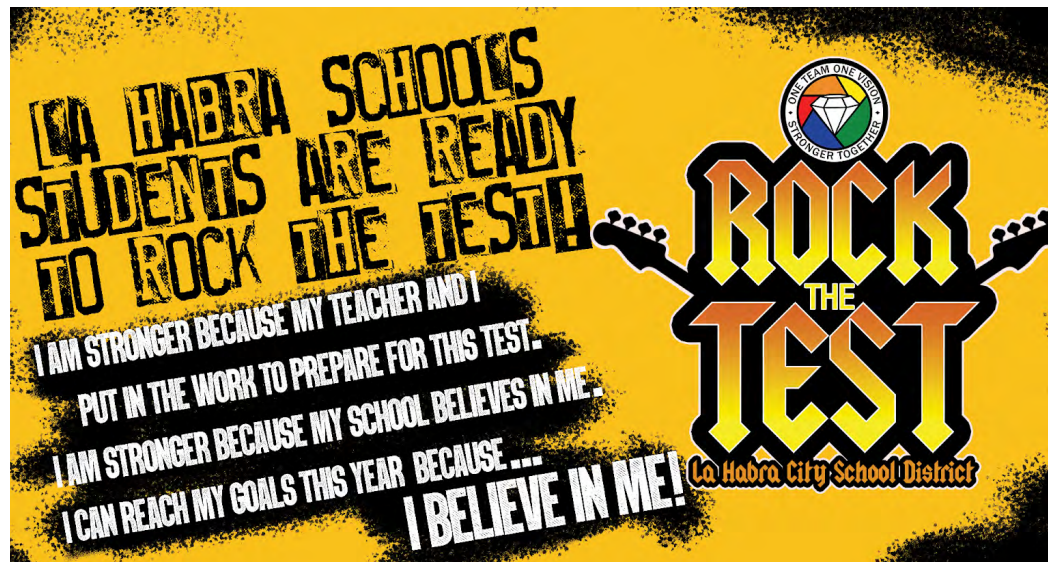
Putting our Learning to the Test

As we near the start of state testing, all students in grades three through eight will have the opportunity to demonstrate their learning. The results of these assessments will identify where students are doing well and where they may need more support in the areas of English Language Arts and Mathematics. Students in grades five and eight will also be assessed in the area of Science.

These adaptive computer based assessments are given over multiple days, allowing for breaks in testing to give students the best opportunity to exhibit

their learning throughout the year. All school sites provide incentives for students before, during, and after testing to motivate and reward them for their hard work and perseverance.

We are confident in the outcome of our students and wish them well as they "Rock the Test!"

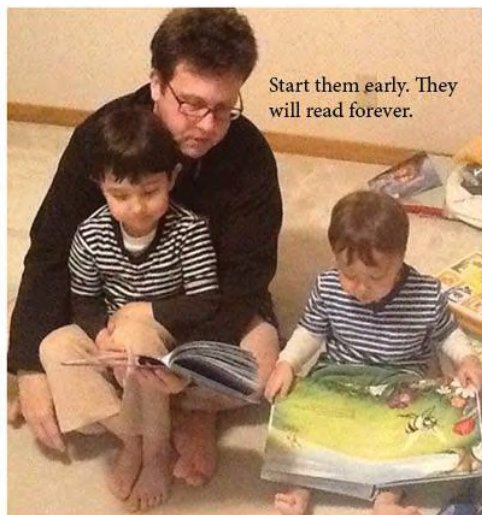
Dr. Carlos begins this issue with his Finish Strong message on page 3. As you read the articles in this issue you will see students are engaged and focused on finishing the school year strong.

Wellness Wednesday

This year, the La Habra City School District has provided monthly parent/caregiver workshops called Wellness Wednesdays. Our school psychologists and counselors have partnered up to help parents support their students' education and wellness as well as their own. Wellness Wednesdays are designed to provide valuable information and strategies for parents/caregivers and to have time to connect and share ideas with others.

Topics that have been covered so far include strengthening family relationships, gratitude through the holidays, social media safety, drug prevention, and healthy communication. Wellness Wednesdays have been offered both in person and by Zoom, and our team looks forward to this continued parent outreach next school year.

Our community liaisons have been supporting food distributions at various school sites Districtwide. In partnership with the Second Harvest Food Bank of Orange County, there have been food distributions once a month at Las Positas, El Cerrito, and Washington Middle School. The first Wednesday of the month, food is distributed at Las Positas; the second Wednesday, food is distributed at El Cerrito; and the third Wednesday, food is distributed at Washington. All families are welcome, and there is no need to provide any ID or address verification to pick up the food. Community liaisons, along with volunteers that include parents and middle school students, help with the food distribution. Each week, they serve approximately 150-180 families at each school site. The middle school Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) donated bags for families to use for the food pick-up.

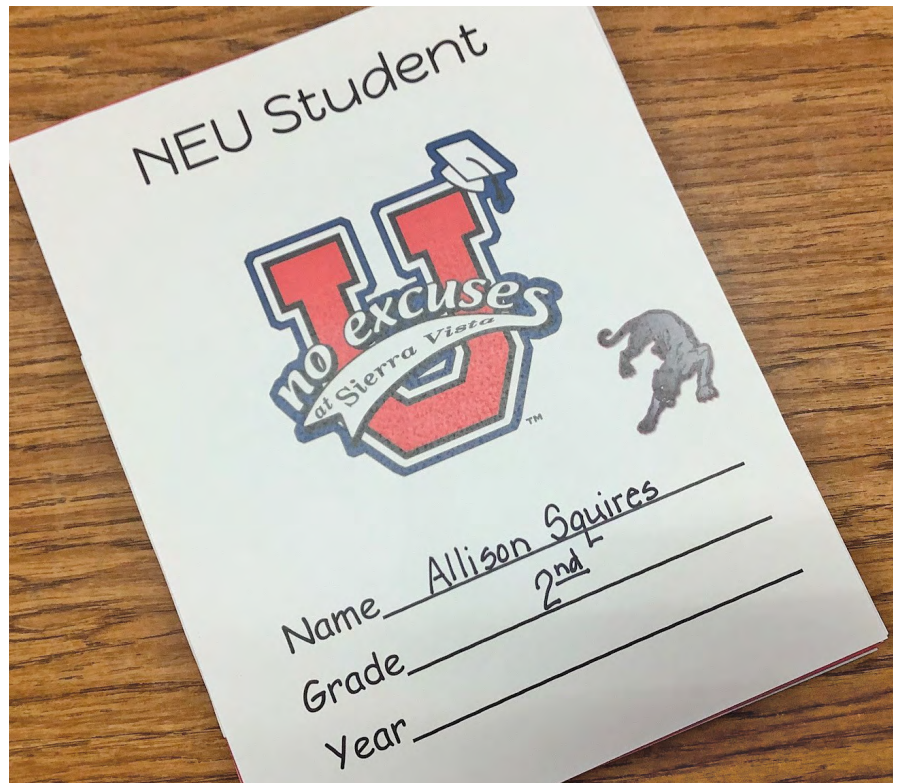

OCDE's Continuous Commitment to Strengthening School Safety

Our children deserve to learn and grow in safe and secure environments, where they can thrive academically and emotionally. And parents should be confident that when they send their children to school, they will return home just as healthy and happy as when they left.

Yet in too many instances, we have seen this social contract ripped apart by

the devastating reality of school violence, leading to the familiar cycle of shock, grief and anger.

I wish I could say I had answers sufficient to prevent this country's next mass shooting. I do not. I can only extend my most heartfelt condolences to anyone impacted by senseless violence, and I can reaffirm here the sustained commitment of the Orange County Department of Education and leaders throughout our region to proactively protect our students and staff.

To give you some background, California schools are required by law to update their Comprehensive Safe School Plans each year. These plans outline each campus's planned responses to various crises, and they are routinely reinforced through site-level drills, including evacuations and shelter-in-place exercises.

Of course the strategies for promoting safety will vary by campus and are ultimately up to each district's locally elected school board and leadership teams, in partnership with teachers, families, staff, students and communities. But our department eagerly supports this work with trainings and workshops throughout the year, covering such topics as safe school plans, behavioral threat assessments, earthquake preparedness, resilience strategies and active-shooter behavioral indicators.

Meanwhile, OCDE works closely with the Orange County Sheriff's Department and other local law enforcement agencies to study everything from cyberbullying to how to best secure school facilities. One key partnership worth noting is with the Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center, or OCIAC, which leverages the reach and resources of the Sheriff's Department, the FBI and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to detect, investigate and prevent criminal and terrorist activity.

OCDE and the Sheriff's Department also team up every summer to host the Safe Schools Conference with the California Department of Education. This three-day event brings together more than 500 educators and law enforcement personnel from throughout the state to discuss issues and trends related to campus violence, bullying, social media, human trafficking, gangs and substance abuse.

In the case of critical incidents impacting schools, OCDE's Crisis Response Network deploys psychologists, nurses, social workers and other personnel to support students and staff during and after emergencies. This team also conducts trainings for schools, youth service providers, parents and students.

Finally, OCDE champions positive school climates and anti-bullying through initiatives such as the Multi-Tiered System of Support framework, Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports, or PBIS, and our One Billion Acts of Kindness campaign, which kicked off in 2016 to promote character and amplify civility in our communities.

In Orange County, we view the pursuit of safer schools as a race with no finish line, and that means our commitment must be equally unwavering and enduring. New threats will continue to emerge, but so too will new technologies, strategies and best practices for protecting students and schools. Above all, we vow to stay vigilant and informed, work closely with our law enforcement partners, and adapt our approaches accordingly.

We owe our children and families nothing less.
