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

Grant for School Safety

The Saddleback Valley Unified School District recently received a grant from Orange County Board of Supervisors Fifth District representative Katrina Foley's office for school safety. The grant is funding a pilot program for enhanced video surveillance technologies and communication radios. The radios were recently distributed to all school sites while the video technologies are in a pilot phase.

Over the last 18 months, the District completed an external site safety assessment of all school sites. Based upon recommendations from the assessment, the Board of Directors allocated an additional two million dollars in funding to enhance District safety measures. Funding will go to enhance perimeter boundaries, video technology, communication, emergency preparedness, and training. Many of these new initiatives are underway.

During the year, the District works closely with law enforcement and many other local districts and agencies to improve safety and security. These include participating in conferences and table top exercises for administrators and District staff. Law enforcement and District leaders are currently working on evaluating and upgrading site drills.

The District hosts regular parent safety meetings that cover a wide variety of topics, including Internet Safety, Fentanyl Awareness, E-Bike Safety and College Hazing. Through these partnerships, narcan and staff training on administering narcan was provided to all school sites.

Through District funds, additional supplies, in the form of emergency backpacks and buckets were delivered to school sites. Site inventories are ongoing to determine future emergency supply needs.

On the District website under the safety section, a safety timeline is posted which outlines safety enhancements undertaken by the District over the last six years. 

Students in the SVUSD STEAM

Academy at El Toro High School have
been collaborating on a variety of amazing
cross-curricular projects that integrate
their core academic and CTE (Career Tech
Education) classes. You may have seen the
ETHS Bioregion Horses our students made
last year. The following are among the many
fantastic projects our STEAM students are

working on this year:

Students in "English 1: Writing Games for Social Change" have worked with our Digital Media Arts program to create video game characters and settings to present to Blizzard Entertainment (creator of many popular video games) for feedback. Soon they will collaborate with our Engineering program to 3D-print related items for their game and our Art program to create artwork that brings their game to life as part of their pitch to Blizzard.

Students in "Biology of the Living Earth and Sustainable Agriculture," "World History by Design," and our Digital Media Arts program have teamed up on the Green Campus Action Plan this year to address recycling around campus, adding greenspaces or plant walls for health and wellness, and decreasing food waste on campus. They are hosting our STEAM Green Day event on April 19th and will use all of this to not only build on our campus health and wellness culture, but to have our school designated as a Green Ribbon School.

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
