

Garvey Intermediate: Meeting the Needs of Students

Garvey Intermediate has made great strides in meeting their academics targets as determined by the California State Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium (SBAC) and English Language Proficiency Assessment for California (ELPAC). Students scored above the state average in all tested subject matters (Language Arts, Math, and 8th grade Science)

on the 2022-23 SBAC while 73% of our English Learners made progress toward English proficiency on the 2022-23 ELPAC. The school has worked tirelessly to prepare students for the upcoming SBAC and ELPAC testing for the 2022-23 school year. Teachers are working diligently to create a safe learning environment where students feel free to ask questions and work collaboratively with their peers. We have also focused on Academic Language targeting language routinely used in our state testing. Teachers

have high expectations for all students making students accountable for their own education by promoting student ownership of their school work through project-based learning.

Students have also participated in artistic endeavors including Advance Band and Advance Choir performances for parents and families, as well as performing for our incoming 7th grade students from the surrounding elementary schools. Our Advanced Art class worked with Studio Tutto, a local art studio, to create a beautiful mural in our Garvey Garden. Students were able to work together and with the artists to turn a normal wall into something our students can be proud of.

This year, our counselors have worked to meet the needs of our students' social emotional welfare as students have return to school full-time following the pandemic. The counselors are providing Social Emotional Learning (SEL) lessons to students hoping to help students cope with the time away from school and their friends.



Preparing Students for the Next Grade Level and Beyond

As the 2022-2023 school year comes to a close, teachers provide opportunities for students to use skills and content standards learned throughout this school year. The students in 4th grade completed a Project Based Learning activity in which they are designing a zoo that required the use of language, science, mathematical and

communication skills as they work cooperatively in their groups as there are assigned task for each member to ensure all students are engaged and contribute to the completion of the project.

In the 6 th grade, students worked in cooperative learning groups to complete science fair projects using the scientific method to help explain abstract concepts with demonstration and experiments. This had assisted students to comprehend and apply what they have learned into an activity that required them to use higher order depth of knowledge thinking. There were also presentations that utilized speaking and listening skills as students explained to their classmates about their experiments. Students used their 21 st Century Skills (collaboration, communication, critical thinking and creativity).
