

Learning about Trees

Teaching preschoolers about trees and nature is a fun and interactive experience for young learners. Therefore, preschool learning foundations are crucial in shaping children's understanding of the world around them. With that in mind, our highly qualified

early childhood educators purposefully incorporate a curriculum that includes a study to explore trees in a six-week term through investigations.

A new investigation is introduced each week with a focus question to spark children's curiosity, wonder, and critical thinking. They learn about the trees' characteristics and their role in our environments. Preschoolers acquire deep knowledge about the creatures that inhabit trees and the foods they produce, in addition to the different parts of the trees, what lives in them, what they are made from, and who cares for them. Observing how preschool children embrace nature and their interest in exploring, predicting, and making conclusions about the trees around them is fascinating!

Most importantly, the tree study helps children explore science and social studies and strengthens their literacy, math, technology, and art skills. It builds upon children's interest in trees and past real-life experiences. During the study, children use literacy, math, technology, and the arts skills to investigate and represent their understanding of trees.

This study has been a successful learning journey for children, staff, and families. Our preschoolers enjoyed every activity where we spent valuable time talking, sharing ideas, and using many new words to increase vocabulary and literacy skills. At Duarte Preschool, we are proud of the seeds of knowledge we are planting in every single child's mind, expecting that they will flourish to their fullest potential in their educational journey and life.

Book Buddies and Literacy

Team Maxwell teachers work together to cultivate a love for literacy at the highest level. Mrs. Brannon's K/1st grade student buddy up with Mrs. Tate's 4th /5th students form book buddies. The book buddies meet once a week to simply read. Buddies allow

kid and a friend to share in the experience of reading the same book together and discussing it. The book buddies read together to improve their reading fluency. One student reads aloud while the other listens and provides support as needed. The roles are then reversed, with each student

Duarte's CTE Workforce Development in Cosmetology and Barbering

Mt. Olive Innovation and Technology High School (MIT) and a local Cosmetology and Barbering School partnered in 2023

to engage student's in workforce development for cosmetology and barbering. This unique partnership offers students full scholarships and the Duarte Career Technical Education (CTE) program covers the cost of student's registration, state board exam fees and cosmetology and barbering kits.

Duarte's CTE goal is to partner with business and industry to develop engaging and meaningful workforce development experiences to guide students to becoming career ready and certified. There are currently fourteen (14) MIT students enrolled in the Cosmetology and Barbering School, Monday through Thursday from 5 pm – 9 pm and on Saturdays from 9 am – 4 pm. Students have to complete 1,000 hours of hands on training, technical instruction and practical operations. In addition, students learn about human physiology, anatomy; shaving, trimming

beards, mustaches, hair cutting, hair styling, shampooing, perming, coloring, skin and nails, facials, safety and more. Once they have completed their hours students are eligible to take the state board exam to earn their certificate in cosmetology and barbering.

This career pathway provides students authentic connections to business and industry in a field related to their career interest and passions. This is an amazing program for Duarte Unified students which provides a roadmap to career readiness and helps them leverage their strengths to build confidence for future success.

Supporting All Students through PBIS

Implementing Positive Behavior
Interventions and Supports (PBIS) in a
school can be a highly effective way to create
a positive and supportive school climate.
Some of the key components for successful
PBIS implementation include clearly defining
and communicating behavior expectations,
explicitly teaching the behavior expectations,
positive reinforcement and consistency. At

Valley View Academy, we make PBIS implementation a priority as a way to best support all of our students. The students of Valley View Academy are continuously working to meet our school PBIS expectations based on the acronym S.W.I.M. This stands for Show respect, Work as a Team, Identify and Solve Problems, and Make Positive Choices. When a student is caught meeting one of these expectations,

they are recognized by staff and awarded a Dolphin Dollar. Last year we began implementation of our SWIM store where students can use their Dolphin Dollars to purchase incentives including snacks, school supplies, fidgets and other fun toys. The SWIM Store is now a part of our school community and students look forward to shopping twice a month. This would not be a reality without the hard work of our PBIS team, support and donations from families, and student volunteers to help run it. In addition to recognizing students with Dolphin Dollars, we end every month with a Student of the Month assembly where one student from each class is recognized for demonstrating characteristics that align to our SWIM expectations in and out of the classroom. The strong implementation of PBIS at Valley View has not only positively impacted our school culture, but we have been recognized for the third year in a row for the Platinum Level Award.
