foster and showcase student voice. In addition, the District continues to invigorate our signature academic programs, including the Dual Language Plus program and STEAM/ Makerspace program, to promote global leaders with multi-lingual, multicultural, and cognitive competencies. Competing at county, state, and national level events, including History Day and Math Field Day, our student leaders have received many awards, demonstrating their remarkable leadership and 21st century skills.

Making a Difference in Nurturing the Whole Child

The new normal in the post-pandemic era has been marked by a concerning increase in social-emotional, mental, and behavioral challenges, particularly among the vulnerable student populations. Through skilled behavioral, mental health and social-emotional staff, the District implements result-proven programs and introduces new research-based initiatives. School teams are strengthening the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) system to support students with diverse behavioral needs. Teachers, working in collaboration with counselors, continue to refine the adopted socialemotional learning (SEL) programs. Schools are optimizing the purposefully designed "wellness center" to provide a physically and emotionally appealing environment for group and individual SEL activities. Social-emotional health surveys are used to identify high-need students for timely intensive support services. We continue on our journey to implement "Capturing Kids' Hearts," a researchbased transformational process that focuses on socialemotional wellbeing, relationship-driven school culture, and student connectedness. Most excitingly, we have recently launched an extended-day engagement program, in partnership with Woodcraft Rangers, that targets students with challenges in attendance and engagement. The program, greatly appreciated by students and parents, includes high-interest excursion activities and counseling services to build leadership, teamwork, goal-setting, and self-monitoring skills.

Making a Difference in Serving our Families & Community

Garvey understands the importance of family in fulfilling the mission of developing the whole child. We are expanding a variety of support services to nurture the whole family. Through the partnership with community agencies, we offer ongoing parent education to build parent and family capacity in providing academic support at home, we conduct physical and mental health workshops to promote self-care practices and parents' skills in ensuring their children's wellness; we offer families on-campus health services, including vaccinations, dental services, and vision screening at the school-based clinic; we provide counseling services to assist families in addressing crisis situations; we gather physical resources for families in need. The Community Resources and Wellness Fair (in September 2023) and Parent Symposium (in May 2024), each with the participation of over twenty community partners and hundreds of parents, exemplify our commitment to bringing the "village" together to serve our families. In addition, this year Garvey is extremely excited to be selected as the first school district to partner with The LA Dodgers Foundation for a school-based baseball program. With Dodgers Foundation providing uniforms and training, parents and staff trained as coaches, and 400 students participating, we see another powerful picture of how the "village" comes together to serve our community.

Dewey Elementary provides various opportunities to show a child's growth and success through academic and socialemotional wellness programs for students. First of all, Dewey Elementary has a STEAM program for all students. Using Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics, students are taught how to build creative problem-solving and critical

thinking skills. Students learn how to use technology hardware such as Beebots, Ozobots, Makey Makey's and Microbits to create hands-on technology projects. Dewey also offers a Dual Language Spanish program. In this program students develop proficiency in English and Spanish. Additionally our students experience a third language enrichment, Chinese Mandarin. We offer during the day and after school intervention. Intervention targets academic support in Language Arts and Mathematics. Students are provided additional support to show academic growth. Next, our school counselor provides SEL lessons to all classes which focuses on the development of understanding diversity, compassion and mindfulness. During the day our school counselor provides various mindful activities in our Wellness Center to provide an opportunity to socially interact with others and make new friends. Students can also become involved in ASB. Our ASB program helps students develop leadership skills and responsibility while promoting school activities.

Garvey Intermediate has demonstrated remarkable progress in meeting our academics targets as determined by the California State Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium (SBAC).

In the 2022-23 SBAC assessments, our students surpassed the state average in all tested subject matters: Language

Arts, Math, and 8 th grade Science. Garvey students achieved 20 percentage points higher than the state average in Language Arts, 25 percentage points higher in Math, and 22 percentage points higher in 8 th Grade Science. This across-the-board improvement positions Garvey as a leading performer among similar schools in our community. We are very proud of this academic accomplishment and remain committed to further growth as we prepare for the upcoming SBAC state testing in the 2023-24 school year. Our dedicated teachers are working diligently to create a safe learning environment where students feel free to ask questions and work collaboratively with their peers. Through targeted instruction in Academic Language, tailored to align with state standards, we believe students will exceed expectations. Teachers have high expectations for all students making them accountable by promoting student ownership of their schoolwork through projectbased learning.

Our students have also showcased their talents in a number of student competitions such as Science Olympiad, Science Bowl, Science Field Day, SeaPearch Competition, History Day, International Academic Competitions (IACs), Spelling Bee, Math Field Day, and the Water Engineering Competition. Our students have represented Garvey Intermediate very well placing and winning many competitions at the local, county, and state level.

A Very Productive Year at Monterey Vista

As the 2023-2024 school year is coming to a close, it had been a busy but productive year for all students and teachers at Monterey Vista. They all worked hard to ensure students are ready and prepared to promote to the next grade level. For students at Monterey Vista, they had the opportunity

to prepare and complete projects in science which helped them to learn about the scientific process as well as preparing them for the CAST Science Test, the history of different states, research papers on animals using multiple sources including technology, and the 100 days activities requiring math skills in counting and basic writing skills. All of these activities require students to utilize multiple resources and evidence and justification for their responses and involved project- based learning.

For Monterey Vista, we have had a big influx of Newcomer English Learners. Many have come with native language skills but there are some with very limited language abilities in both English and their native language. However, when teachers have high expectations for them, all students including English Learners will rise to the occasion. With the support of their teachers, they not only have equal access to grade level curriculum, but also being able to use 21st century skills (the 4 Cs) and technological tools in their presentations. Our 6th grade teacher, Mr. Ortiz, required all of his students including beginning and emerging English Learners to complete a powerpoint presentation using graphics and oral language skills to explain their projects and findings to the class. Newcomers are encouraged to speak and use both their oral and written skills to explain their report using their native language. We, at Monterey Vista, always strive for 100% student engagement.

We believe it is vital to provide a warm and inclusive environment for students new to Rice and U.S. schools in general. Our entire school community, from our office staff to teachers and other certificated and classified staff, comes together to ensure our new students feel safe, supported, and welcomed. During their welcome tour of the school, we provide them with a Rice School water bottle and backpack if needed. We make sure they are introduced to everyone in the office, cafeteria,

intervention room, Wellness Center, and, most recently, our library. Our dedicated Counselor, Mrs. Rodriguez, plays a crucial role in prioritizing our new friends' well-being by conducting regular check-ins with them. This ensures that they are adjusting well to our school environment. Our students know that they can visit the Wellness Center whenever they need a safe space to relax or chat with Mrs. Rodriguez, Ms. Yaxeni, or Ms. Jesse - our Behavior Intervention Aides. To further support language development for those who are brand new to U.S. schools, Mr. Tjiong (our intervention teacher) and Mrs. Mendoza (our intervention aide) provide an extensive English Language Development program specifically for "newcomers." This comprehensive support system ensures our new students feel welcomed and supported at Rice School.

Growing and Supporting Educators

In today's educational landscape, recruiting and retaining quality teachers are paramount to the success of our students. The Los Angeles County Office of Education is dedicated to fostering a thriving educational environment, and that starts with our teachers. Through a series of groundbreaking

programs and strategic partnerships, LACOE is reshaping the pathway to teaching and ensuring that our educators feel valued, supported, and empowered throughout their careers.

Beginning Teacher Programs

LACOE launched the Beginning Teacher Programs, the largest county-operated program of its kind. This initiative offers two unique pathways for aspiring teachers to earn their credentials:

- District Intern Program: This two-year program allows candidates to gain valuable classroom experience while attending afternoon classes. Participants earn their preliminary credentials upon completion.
- Induction Program: This apprenticeshipstyle program pairs aspiring teachers with experienced mentors. Over two years, participants gain hands-on experience and earn their Clear credential.

Both programs prioritize affordability. Our District Intern Program boasts a low tuition of just \$5,000 per year, minimizing financial burdens for new teachers.

Supporting Teachers Beyond Credentials

Studies show a high turnover rate among new teachers in their initial years. Recognizing this challenge, LACOE actively support our educators during this critical period. We conduct surveys to understand the specific needs and struggles faced by teachers in their fifth year. Based on this feedback, we offer targeted resources and programs to ease their transition.

Investing in Early Childhood Education

LACOE understands the importance of a strong foundation in early childhood education. Through the Career Development Initiative, we've partnered with the Los Angeles County Department of Economic Opportunity, West LA College and Pierece College to provide free community college education and on-site training for individuals interested in early childhood education and childcare careers.

Connecting Educators with Opportunities

LACOE is partnering with the Tulare County Office of Education to host hybrid job fairs that cater to a wide range of educational positions. These fairs are open to both domestic and international candidates with work visas, attracting a global pool of talent. Our upcoming K-12 hybrid career fair on May 18th offers positions not just for teachers, but also for nurses, counselors, and office staff. Over 15 educational agencies will be participating, making it a valuable opportunity for anyone seeking a career in education.

By prioritizing innovative training programs, affordability, and ongoing support, our district is fostering a pipeline of qualified and dedicated educators. This commitment ensures our students have access to the exceptional teachers they deserve.
